Casting Clinic Update





Saturday, August 27th 8:00AM to 1:00PM

For those new to fly fishing or wanting to learn more about this fun and exciting way to enjoy our great outdoors.. Join us! Expert casters and fly fisherman will be hosting a casting clinic at Mile Square Regional Park in Fountain Valley to demonstrate and coach attendees in basic fly casts, tips for intermediates, ways to improve your casting... which will improve your fishing!

We'll also have a **BBQ lunch** after the sessions so you can neighbor with other FFCOC members and avid fly fisherman. Share info on the great spots to go fish, ideas on the best gear to get started with, learn more about our club.

<u>What to Bring?</u> If you have a favorite fly rod, reel, line and leader.. Bring it. If not, the club has equipment for you to use. Bring sunscreen, hat and eye protection (sunglasses or glasses).

Where: Mile Square Park - Shelter 1 at the South Pond

Directions from southbound Interstate 405 - Exit Warner Avenue and travel east to Euclid Street (about 1¾ mile), turn left on Euclid Street, turn left into first park entrance (there is a \$5.00 parking fee). **Shelter 1** is at the pond just past this entrance.

Directions from northbound Interstate 405 - Exit Euclid Street and turn left at signal traveling north on Euclid past Warner Avenue (about 1 mile), turn left into first park entrance (there is a \$5.00 parking fee). **Shelter 1** is at the pond just past this entrance.

The drive is approx. 8.5 hours from Ontario Airport. You will drive your own vehicle to the fishing locations and the return, usually within 1 hour of the fly shop, no 4 wheel drive necessary. Be at the fly shop at 8 a.m.

Tipping is considered normal, \$40-50 per day per person.


Lodging & Food: Circle Valley Anglers has a house attached to the fly shop it rents for \$99 per night and sleeps 3. Very comfortable



Last year the FFCOC's On the River Classes and Clinic got off to a great start. Joe Libeu lead the way by providing six hours of classroom training followed by a two day Clinic on the Owens River for 16 participants with help from 8 experienced FFCOC members. The training was focused on learning the basics of fly fishing and was in follow

up to FFCOC's Annual Casting Clinic. This year's program will be similar with preference given to New Club Members. Add address

The program will include everything needed to plan and prepare for a successful fly fishing trip.

Classroom training subjects include:

- Equipment and rigging for nymph fishing
- Insect life cycles and how flies imitate them
- How trout behave
- Clues as to what fish eat
- Stream care and etiquette
- Reading the water
- And much more

The On the River Clinic will be held on the Lower Owens River near Bishop, CA. Many of the items discussed in the classroom setting will be covered in the field. In addition, the following will be included as part of the on the river clinic:

- Reading the stream
- In-stream entomology
- Casting including mending
- Setting the depth of flies using indicators
- Numerous demonstrations
- Fishing, one-on-one with experienced club members

This training will be in follow up to FFCOC's annual Casting Clinic scheduled for Saturday August 27. The Casting Clinic is open to the public so you can bring your friends and neighbors! If you would like information regarding the casting clinic, you should contact Art Prangley at:

Fly Tying

Flies That Keep On Giving

On occasion I tie flies for a few friends and acquaintances. A friend and I were fishing in Utah a few years back and while fishing these waters, Water boatman began to fly from on high and hit the lake and swim down the water column. I had nothing to match the hatch. Now he found an article and it had such a fly. As always, I simplified the pattern because it used lead. This one is easy to tie.

Hook: Daiichi 1530 or similar Bead: 3/32" Black Tungsten

Thread: Sheer 14/0 or 70 UTC in Black Back Shell: Thin Skin Mottled Bustard

Under Shell: Crystal Flash

Dubbing: Ice **Dub** Peacock Black

Legs: Floss-Flex Black

Head Cement: Loctite UltraGel Super Glue



Place the bead on the hook, small hole first. Place a smear of super glue on the shank. Start your thread behind the eye and build a small dam to keep the bead in place and wrap the thread to the bend. Cut a piece of the Thin Skin 3/16" wide the length of the strip, this will tie several flies. Place tie thin Skin on the hook and tie in at the bend and leave to the rear. Cut from the hank of crystal flash 8 strands and tie in by the butts at the bend and leave to the rear, I find wetting the strands with saliva keeps them together every time I pick them up. Dub the abdomen forward leaving ½ eye space behind the bead. Fold the crystal Flash over the dubbed abdomen and tie off in the gap behind the bead and cut off excess and save for next fly. Fold the Shell Back over and tie off in the same gap behind the bead and cut off excess and save for next fly. Tie in the Floss-Flex on either side of the body at the gap and cut to 1 ¼ the body length. Dub a slight amount of dubbing in the gap and coat the thread with a slight amount of super glue and whip finish. This technique makes for a quite durable fly. Water Boatman like still water and slow moving eddies.
