

It's actually a fly-fishing bonanza waiting to be discovered. Utah's undiscovered waters are only a 9-1/2 hour drive from Orange County.



At last September's auction Richard Fanning and I bid on and won a 2 for 1package to participate in the *Advanced Nymphing Clinic on the Lower Owens River* donated by *Joe Libeu's Sierra Pacific Fly Fishing Adventures*. Richard and I attended the clinic on February 11 and 12th and were joined by fellow club member Marvin Crocker. The two day clinic consisted of class-room style instruction (in lawn chairs by the river), knot tying and leader building demonstrations, in-stream demonstrations, individual coaching of each participant by Joe Libeu, and a lot of camaraderie. In addition to reviewing nymphing fundamentals some of the thing we worked on were: depth control (fly spacing, leader and tippet lengths, strike indicator placement, and varying the amount of weight used); casting with nymphing rigs; line control (tip mends, mends for accelerating nymph descent, etc.); strike indicator reading; reading the water to determine when Czech Nymphing is appropriate; Czech Nymphing rigging and technique; and hook setting for the different nymphing techniques. Although the focus of the clinic was to learn and practice various nymphing techniques, we also managed to land a few fish and fish some dry flies. This was a great opportunity to improve my nymphing skills and get to enjoy the fellowship of other club members. I'm sure I would have caught a more, and larger, fish over the years if I had attended this or Sierra Pacific's beginning clinic when I first started fly fishing.

Have a great March; I look forward to seeing you at the March 14th meeting to learn the secrets to successful fishing in the Utah area.

We are now half way through our fly tying classes. Because we have such dedicated fly tying instructors in our club, we are instructing approximately 23 students in four different classes. A fun time is being had by one and all. Every Tuesday night is looked forward to with enthusiasm. Our "Guest Tyers" have been fabulous. They have exceeded my expectations with the flies and talent they are bringing to us. Our beginning class is realizing just how much satisfaction they get by creating (and fishing) their own artificial flies. They are receiving a solid base of information and instructions that will carry them through their own fly tying careers. We currently have two intermediate fly tying classes. These students are demonstrating a passion for this craft and an ability to handle different fly tying materials whether natural or synthetic. They are also learning to recognize good quality material (and what to look out for in poor quality). Our advanced tying class is extremely fortunate to be able to be instructed by so many different instructors, each with their own style and fly preferences. The FFCOC can't thank REI/Tustin enough for allowing us to utilize their Community Room. It is large, well lit and centrally located. All of our fly tying students are anticipating learning more in the next three weeks.



Flies That Keep On Giving

On a trip to Southern Utah guided by Mike James of the Quiet Flyfisher we were fishing many different situations mostly lakes but with a little stream action thrown in for good measure. We hiked to a small lake on Boulder Mountain that kicked the crap out of me, the hike was worth it. We had been fishing a few nymphs but to my surprise he said they wouldn't take a nymph, I tried anyway, (of course) He pulled out a Damsel fly imitation that looked enticing and I realize why we hired a guide. I will share it with you because I now carry it with me in my dry box. Just know there are several colors of Damsels but this is the one we used with great success both on the mountain and on lower lakes.

Electric Blue Damsel



Hook: Tiemco 2488 #10
Thread: Peacock Blue 8/0
Eyes: Mono Eyes Black Small

Abdomen: Rainy's Blue Foam Damsel Fly Bodies 3/64" Round

Thorax: Peacock Blue Antron Dubbing **Wings:** Pearl Stiff Krystal long pack

The first one takes a little time, be patient. You can get two flies from each piece of foam Secure your hook in the vise and start the thread behind the eye of the hook. Use a sharpie permanent maker in black to color the segmentations on the foam and let dry a few minutes. Tie in the eyes 1/8"behind eye of hook with a figure eight pattern and add a drop of head cement or super glue to make sure they don't pivot. Run the thread to the bend and tie in the foam body leaving enough to fold over a dubbed body and tie off behind the eye of the hook

Tie in ten strands of crystal flash 3" long by the middle and figure eight over and around the strands, head cement or super glue the figure eight so the strands are secure (I use super glue). Dub around and the tie in point of the wings and up to the eyes. Fold the foam over and just ahead of the eyes and tie down and whip finish and head cement. Lift the wings up from both sides of fly and mark with a sharpie then cut so they are just short of the tail of the fly

I have been fortunate to meet Mike James, he has added a new dimension to my fishing pleasure. I fished this fly with great success for Tiger Trout just check out the mouth of the fish.

Commission Rejects Striped Bass Eradication Proposal

In a move celebrated by anglers and conservationists, the California Fish and Game Commission in Sacramento on Thursday, February 2 took final action to reject the Department of Fish and Game's controversial proposed changes to striped bass regulations.

In a unanimous 4-0 decision, Commissioners voted not to pursue a proposal that would have liberalized sport fishing regulations related to anadromous striped bass, including increasing bag limits and decreasing size limits. Hundreds of anglers from an array of fishing groups attended the meeting and dozens spoke in opposition to what they described as the striped bass "eradication" proposal.
