

Flies That Keep On Giving

October has arrived and what does that mean to me?

The big boys and girls come out to spawn in the fall, the October Caddis do as well. The October Caddis is a bit larger and a meal that can't be ignored. I have fished the hatch before and find it amazing to be a part of, so out of this love and a trip back to Southern Utah on the immediate horizon I developed my version of the bug. After you tie a few they are quick.

Willie's October Caddis



Hook: Daiichi 1160 #10-14

Bead: 1/8" Black Tungsten

Thread: Rust Brown 6/0 Uni Thread

Rib: .5 Stretch Magic bead and jewelry cord from Michael's

Abdomen dubbing: Ice Dubbing Salmon Pink

Bottom Legs: Brown Hen's saddle feathers

Antennae: Lemon Wood Duck

Thorax: Rocky Mountain Seal-ex dubbing Medium Olive

Front of Thorax: Ice Dubbing UV Light Olive

Place the bead on the hook small end first. Start your thread behind the bead. Tie in a 6" piece of stretch cord and wind the thread over the cord to the bend at the back. Dub the abdomen with Ice dubbing Salmon Pink to the $\frac{3}{4}$ forward point. Wrap the abdomen with concentric wraps of the stretch cord forward and tie off at the $\frac{3}{4}$ point. Tie in a few, 6-10 brown hen saddle fibers beard style at the $\frac{3}{4}$ point and let them hang to the hook point. Tie in four wood duck fibers at the $\frac{3}{4}$ point and let them extend over the back and to the rear twice the abdomen length. At this time place a slight amount of super glue on the wraps, only a slight amount for durability. Dun the Seal-ex loosely at the $\frac{3}{4}$ point. Dub in front of the seal-ex the ice dubbing light olive loosely and whip finish behind the bead to fill in the gap and to build up a band slightly. Add a slight dap of super glue and your done after you tease out some fibers from the dubbing. If you haven't fished the fall you have miss out on the best fishing of the year.



SAN JUAN RIVER, NEW MEXICO *MARCH 22-26, 2013*

Last year nine club members traveled to Aztec, New Mexico to fish the San Juan River, and we had a great trip. We are planning a return trip in 2013 and now is the time to get your name on the list for some fantastic fishing.

The San Juan River is located in Northwest corner of New Mexico, about 20 minutes from Aztec, New Mexico. The San Juan River is a tailwater, famous for it's large fish, eating tiny midges and baetis mayflies. It fishes well year round trip. Guide prices are \$375 for two people/full day and lodging is 85-90/night for two people. Participants can elect to use a guide for 1-3 days or wade on their own, all or some of those days. If you have never fished the San Juan River before, it is recommended that you use a guide for at least 1-2 days.

Participants have the options of A. driving (750 miles=12 hours), B. flying to Farmington, New Mexico (about \$462 with two stops) and driving to Aztec (about 20 miles) C. flying to Albuquerque (\$360-\$410) and driving to Aztec (about 3 hours). THE WEST FORK SAN GABRIEL RIVER IS ALMOST DRY

Cogswell Reservoir is only two feet deep. Concerns have been raised to the LA County Department of Public Works by conservation groups regarding the lack of water which has put the aquatic life of the entire canyon in jeopardy. One of the key issues being pointed out for lack of water flow are old valves that have been leaking for many years. Repairs scheduled to take place for the past several years have been cancelled including this year. Future repair date may not be re-scheduled until sometime in 2014. Based on a signed agreement between the LA County of Public Works and various conservation groups the department is to maintain and care for the West Fork by insuring at least a 10 cubic foot per second flow, with the only exception being a severe drought.

The pictures shown below were taken on Sunday, November 4, 2012. Because the water flow is down to a trickle, most of the river is full of algae blooms making the water turn a green color. The picture on the left was taken directly below Cogswell Dam. The picture on the right was taken at the second bridge.

Currently only pools contain water.

I will keep you informed as I hear more.
