



FREE FLY FISHING CLASSES 2023 FFCOC On The River Classes and Clinic

(aka Fly Fishing 101)

The Fly Fishing Club of Orange County's (FFCOC's) On The River Classes and Clinic program is in it's eighth year. It is a perfect way for new, and less-experienced, fly fishers to learn the art of fly fishing. The program which is open to Club Members intro-

duces participants to the fundamentals of fly fishing including the equipment, techniques and science of catching fish. The program is a great introduction to a sport you can enjoy for the rest of your life.

Joe Libeu, a member of the FFCOC, is a Fly Fishers International Certified Master Caster Instructor and professional guide. He developed and instructs Advanced Nymphing Clinics on the Owens River. Several experienced club members assist Joe providing hands-on training during the On The River Clinic.

The program includes everything needed to plan and prepare for a successful fly-fishing trip. Classroom training subjects include equipment, insect life cycles and how flies imitate them, how trout behave, clues as to what fish eat, stream care and etiquette, reading the water, nymph rigging and much more.





The On The River Clinic is held on the Kern River near Kernville. Many of the items discussed in the classroom setting are covered in the field. In addition, the on the river clinic includes reading the stream, entomology, casting, mending, setting depth of flies using indicators, and numerous demonstrations. The program includes fishing one-on-one with one of the more experienced club members.

Club News - Fish Tales

Damage to the Upper Santa Ana River from Tropical Storm Hilary A Fish Tale Habitat Report by: Brian Mayer

For those Club members like me who have enjoyed fishing the upper Santa Ana River from the South Fork campground down to Seven Oaks, I have some unfortunate news. In August, Tropical Storm Hilary thoroughly devastated this section of the river and damaged Highway 38 in several locations. CALTRANS completely closed the highway for repairs, and only opened it to weekend traffic on November 17. At the end of the Thanksgiving weekend, I was able to drive up to the area and survey the damage and repairs being made. Water and debris flows scoured 50 foot wide sections completely stripping the trees and riparian willows. In some areas, the riverbank was eroded down 15 to 20 feet. Several cabins along the river had their foundations undermined by the rushing waters.

I think it will be some time before there will be any fish catching in this area.

Here are some pictures that I took at the bridge where Highway 38 crosses over the Santa Ana River and the area of the South Fork Campground.



1. "It will be crowded on the Owens" - this is a myth. On any given weekend from January through March, 2-3 clubs may be up there fishing with up to 100+ members. The Tournament has attracted far less and the clubs have avoided the weekend because of the fear of crowding. Instead of trying to coordinate your club outing for the same weekend (nothing wrong with that at all!), encourage a few members to show up and represent your club and win the team category.



- 2. "The Tournament is open to fly and gear"—True and most of us came from the gear world. It is still a catch and release tournament and the two methods of fishing compete in different divisions. Your club members can invite their gear friends and have fun together.
- 3. "Competition is not what fly fishing is all about" If there was a \$10K prize, I could see that. But we give away a few rods and reels and some silly prizes too and have a lot of fun. On a side note, our audience is skewed to the younger age range; something the clubs are trying to attract. Come on up and talk to these folks and get them interested in fishing, and joining your club!

I think that is about it. Teams can be of any size and the cost is pretty minimal (\$25 individual and \$20 per team). Let's see if we can turn this event into a club gathering. More fun than Club Management Day!



Flies That Keep On Giving!

Fitsimon's Midge Adult

During our travels this Fall, while in Glenwood Springs, CO (Roaring Fork Anglers), our guide showed us this midge in his fly box; the Fitsimon Midge. I found this midge on one of the Fly-Tying Facebook pages. It's a popular fly for the Frying Pan River, which is a tributary of the Roaring Fork River in Colorado. It is successfully used in western waters, anywhere trout are feeding on midges. I wasn't able to find a YouTube video to see how it was tied, so with just a picture and using fly tying materials I had on hand I experimented and came up with my version of the Fitsimon's Midge Adult. I tied up in several, in different sizes and in an evening had stocked my fly box with these flies — ready for my next fly-fishing trip. Can't have enough midges in your fly box; dries, emergers and nymphs! Here is my version...



Materials:

Hook: Dry fly hook. I used a Firehole 419, size 18

Thread: Uni 8.0 Cahill

Wing: Sparkling Emerger Yarn Clear/White

or an equivalent

Hackle: Grizzly Hackle Thorax: Peacock Hurl

Cement: Loctite

Instructions:

- 1. Put the hook in the vise and wrap thread over the shank to the bend.
- 2. For the wing (sparkling Emerger Yarn Clear/White or an equivalent) measure it out at approximately ½ length of the shank and tie this on at the bend of the hook, leaving the ½ length hanging off the back of the hook. Make sure that the wing material doesn't roll off the top of the hook. Fold the excess material back (out of the way) and clip with a material clip.
- 3. Tie in a prepared grizzly hackle and wrap it forward covering about 2/3 of the hook shank. Tie off and trim.
- 4. Tie in a peacock hurl (mine were pretty stringy so I used two peacock hurls) and wrap a tight thorax. Tie off and trim.

Flies That Keep On Giving!

5. Unclip the wing material (Sparkling Emerger Yarn Clear/White or an equivalent) and lay it over the top of the hook, parting the grizzly hackles and peacock hurl to either side. Tie off right behind the eye of the hook. Trim and whip finish, and glue (I use Loctite super glue, but even clear nail polish will work, too).
