# Offbeat Tactics That Catch Trout

with Ed Engle

Every now and then the standard tactics that usually catch trout don't work. For these special cases a nontraditional approach may be necessary for a successful day on the river. You might want to consider unorthodox tactics such as, instead of throwing streamers across a

stream and letting them swing through the current, you cast them downstream, alongthe same side of the river as where you are and then strip them back upstream. Or using large, spent spinner imitations as attractor flies, or drowning terrestrial patterns, or actively fishing nymph imitations. Other uncommon tactics might includehigh-sticking dry flies, presenting standard attractor fly patterns in new ways or swinging dry flies on a tight line. The program you are going to see this month explains, as well as shows, the importance of on-the-stream innovation when you are faced with unusual or difficult fishing conditions. You'll learn that having the ability to let go of all your preconceived notionsoften results in success and may ultimately carry over into a more thoughtful and innovative approach to all of your days on the water.

Ed Engle has been an avid fly fisherman for the past 40 years and has fly fished throughout the continental United States, Alaska, Mexico, Chile, Argentina, Canada and Europe for a variety of game fish species, but with a special emphasis on trout. He was born in Virginia, though has lived most of his life inColorado. He got into fly fishing when he saw people catching fish using this method, expressed a desire to do it and was fortunate when his dad gave him a starter kit. Ed attended the University of Colorado in Boulder and graduated with a degree in biology. Living in Colorado, Ed has had ample opportunity to perfect his skills on all kinds of streams, using all types of flies. Today his home and office are just west of Colorado Springs, within 40 miles of the South Platte River, one of Colorado's premier tailwaters.

Ed's fly fishing articles have appeared regularly in newspapers and magazines for more than 35 years. In the 1970's, his articles on nymphing techniques were among the first to appear in national fly fishing magazines. Since that time he has taught thousands of fly fishers the subtle art of nymphing through his books and articles, on-the-water seminars and at his popular nymphing class sponsored by the Fly Fishing Show.

Ed is especially interested in small fly tactics and techniques. His small fly research has taken him to many of the west's famous tailwater and spring creeks across the country. He is also dedicated to fly fishing small streams for beautiful wild trout. Ed balances his interest in the "small side of fly fishing" with the avid pursuit of king salmon on the fly.

Ed is a regular contributor to the *Boulder Daily Camera* and *Gray's Sporting Journal*. In addition, he has written for *American Angler*, *Fly Fisherman*, *Fly Rod & Reel*, *Flyfishing & Tying Journal*, *Trout*, *Fly Tyer*, *Sports Afield*, and *Saltwater Fly Fishing*.

If we look at the books he has authored we can see yet another reason he is so qualified to lead us on this journey. Ed's most recent book, *Trout Lessons* (Stackpole, 2010), considers what to do when your usual fly fishing solutions don't work. Hisinterest in tying and fishing small flies led to the publication of *Tying Small Flies* (Stackpole, 2004) and *Fishing Small Flies* (Stackpole, 2005). The two-volume set is credited with helping create the current surge of interest in pursuing trout with small flies. Ed's dedication to fishing bamboo fly rods resulted in the publication of *Splitting Cane* (Stackpole, 2002) which chronicled the life and craftsmanship of sixteen working rod makers. His first fly fishing book, *Fly Fishing the Tailwaters* (Stackpole, 1991), was a groundbreaking explanation of how to fish the regulated rivers found below dams.

Ed's current projects include writing posts for his popular, Lone Angler Journal blog, work on

a new book, coming up with new small fly patterns, and teaching at fly fishing seminars throughout the country.

# MAMMOTH MENTOR OUTING June 12-15, 2015

The Club has planned a <u>3 day</u> Mentor Outing to the Mammoth Lake's area for June 12-15, 2015. The outing is designed as a basic introduction to fly fishing the eastern Sierra and is geared to novice fly fishers, and those wanting to become more familiar with the Mammoth Lakes area. Club members will be on hand to provide assistance and will lead car pool groups to a variety of area waters for those not working with the professional guides.

Novice anglers will get to work with professional guides on fishing basics. Saturday participants will work on basics, and some on-water activities with a guide from The Troutfitter. On Sunday we will meet with a guide supplied by Tahoe Fly Fishing Outfitters and learn the basics of fishing the East Walker River. There is no extra cost to participants for the guides. There may however, be a limit to the group size that will be working with the guides.

The Club reserved group campsite No. 9 at the Pine Glen Group Campground in Mammoth Lakes, CA. The campground is located adjacent to the Forest Service Ranger Station and Welcome Center off of Highway 203. Water and toilets are at the campground. Saturday evening is a planned potluck dinner. Sunday morning breakfast will be provided. There will be camp stoves available for use and some basic cooking utensils. The weather in June can be quite variable so bring cold weather gear along with the sunscreen.

The outing will cover basic fishing strategies and visit a few streams and lakes in the area. Fly rods from 3-6 weight will work well. If floating a lake a 5-6 weight rod is recommended. We will do a meet and greet stop at one of the area fly shops. An evening program is being planned for Saturday. There are plenty of non-fishing activities in the area for those attending that are not anglers.

There may be opportunity to learn basics of lake fishing using float tubes (weather permitting). Please **contact Lyman Kennedy** (714) 742-5865 if you are interested in learning to fish from a belly boat on this trip. There are also options for renting tubes. Each float tube participant needs a Personal Flotation Device.

This outing is a great introduction to fishing Mammoth area lakes and streams. While the campsite can accommodate up to 25 people, feel free to make alternate lodging arrangements in Mammoth and still participate in Club activities. A trip sign-up sheet will be circulated beginning with the March Club meeting. Hope to see you on this great family friendly trip.

I have heard that the main topic of conversation at club meetings etc. has been frantic about the upcoming fishing season and that many folks are in a panic over it and even thinking of hanging it up until we get some water.


I would like to give you a few facts. Hot Creek is a spring creek. 85% of our summer water comes from the upstream springs. While the main springs are 30% down, we still have 70% of our water, which puts us in **much better shape** than most fisheries in the state! The water situation is not at its best but fishing can still be pretty darn good and FUN if you are willing to work a little more than you might be used to.

I have been walking the creek every day and there are plenty of fish in the system! They are all not in the usual places which will mean you may have to figure it out a bit but that is the fun of it!! We have all seen those banner years when fishing was really easy! Well, there is a balance to everything in life and this probably won't be one of those years, however, it can still be fun! Maybe instead of telling your friends about how MANY fish you caught, you can tell them about how you hooked those tough fish that you worked on for a while and finally got them to eat. ### **Fly Tying**

## FLIES THAT KEEP ON GIVING Mini M&M Caddis



By John Williams

**Hook:** Tiemco 2488 #18-22

Thread: UTC 70 Olive Body: Peacock Hurl

Under Wing: Antron Lt. Olive YarnOver Wing: Wood duck flank feathersHackle: Ginger or Grizzly hackle

Start your thread at the eye and wrap to the bend of the hook above the barb. Tie in one peacock hurl by the tip and wrap forward to the ¾ forward point and tie off with a couple of wraps of thread, cut the remainder off. Tie in the under wing leaving it to extend twice the shank length. Fold a wood duck feather tent style and hold on top of the under wing and tie in place where you finished the under wing with a few wraps of thread. Tie in the hackle and make two to three wraps depending on the quality of your feather, tie off and whip finish. Add a slight amount of head cement with your bodkin.

Trout will hate me for this downsizing.

- tiers that have previously taken Mike's beginning class.
- Dr. Frank Rose for donating several fly tying took kits and a Fish Skull Fly Tester.
- The twenty students that expressed an interest in learning making this all possible.



The photo to the left is the Fish Skull Fly Tester donated by Dr. Rose. It allowed us to see the action of many of the flys we tied in various currents as well as some favorites of various class members. In addition to this tester, Rich Fanning brought in a drop tube we filled with water to see the relative sink rates of nymphs tied in

class. The results, with the slowest rate listed first, were - no added weight, standard bead head, standard bead head with about a dozen wraps of lead wire, and a titanium bead. See Rich for the details if you're interested.

The photo to the right is Cheryl Moore watching the action of a Steelhead fly she brought in for the Fly Tester demonstration. The photo below shows the action of one of Cheryl's Steelhead flies in the tester with a bubble formed above its tail.





Lyman is a stickler on detail and in the photo to the right students are making sure not miss any of Lyman's fly tying secrets.





As part of Richard's class he asked participants to demonstrate different fly tying techniques. Young Jik Kong responded by demonstrating wing tying on the mayfly spinner to the left and Cheryl responded by demonstrating tube flies as shown below.



Bottom line – we learned a lot and enjoyed doing it. Keep an eye on future newsletters for the scheduling of the next fly tying class.
