

This Month's Meeting

Fly Fishing through Midlife Heaven with Jeff Currier

While many men in their fifties experience what is commonly labeled a “Midlife Crisis,” Jeff Currier believes he may have died and gone to heaven. In 2009, during the most difficult financial times America had experienced since the Great Depression, Jeff quit his day job of running a fly shop for almost 25 years and took off on his own. Why? To follow his dreams.


Jeff wanted to focus on being an artist, pursue a career speaking about fly fishing, do more writing and, best of all, not have to ask permission every time he had an opportunity to go on a fishing trip. His friends and family told him he was crazy, but his wife fully supported his decision.

Let's just say opportunities to go on fishing trips have been the bulk of Jeff's new career. Since that last day in the fly shop, Jeff has traveled to more than 50 countries, added 100 pages to his passport and caught more than 200 new species of exotic fish to lengthen what was already his long list.

No doubt Jeff has been fortunate. During his “Fly Fishing through Midlife Heaven” presentation, you will be able to relax and enjoy the stories of how these amazing trips landed in Jeff's lap. Then, tighten your seatbelt as Jeff treats you to fly fishing for tigerfish in Tanzania, golden mahseer in India, a variety of saltwater species from the Red Sea of Sudan, as well as the islands of the Seychelles. And last but not least, be ready to see the arapaima, the world's largest game fish succumb to a fly in the rainforest of Guyana.

Jeff was born in Massachusetts and grew up fly fishing throughout New England. Today he resides in Victor, Idaho with his wife Yvonne (affectionately known to all as Granny) where he bases his globetrotting career in fly fishing.

Jeff's articles, photographs and artwork have graced the pages of magazines, catalogs, brochures and books. He is the author of *Currier's Quick and Easy Guide to Saltwater Fly Fishing* and *Currier's Quick and Easy Guide to Warmwater Fly Fishing* guide books. These books have become the standard introductions to saltwater and warmwater fly fishing. When not fishing or writing, Jeff is usually found working on one of his



favorite hobbies, painting fish. His fish art decorates T-Shirts, fly reels, coffee mugs, books, magazines and his original watercolors are always in high demand.

Jeff is also a sought after expert for television programs, appearing on *Fishing the West*, *Fly Fishing the World*, *In Search of Fly Water*, *Reel Adventures*, *Fly Fish TV* and *Fly Fish America*. Jeff was also a featured angler in the popular fly fishing DVDs *Evolution*, *Carpland*, *Waypoints*, *Connect* and *Soulfish 2*.

Although Jeff spends much of his time fly fishing for trout, he is a walking encyclopedia of fly fishing for species worldwide. He is an IGFA World Record holder and National Fresh Water Fishing Hall of Fame Record holder and has fished in more than fifty-five countries and caught 325 species of fish on the fly.

Jeff has won numerous fly casting competitions, the Jackson Hole “One Fly” and competed throughout the world in fly fishing. Jeff’s most recognized accomplishment was leading Team USA to its first ever top-ten finish in the World Flyfishing Championships in Jaca, Spain. During the competition, Jeff managed to fool fish on every venue and placed third in the individual standings, becoming the first American ever to take home a medal in the thirty-year history of the Championships.

He is an active member of the R.L. Winston Rod Co Professional Advisory Team, as well as Simms, Scientific Anglers, Costa Sunglasses, Yeti, Bauer Reels and Kate’s Real Foods. Jeff is a “Fishing Ambassador” for Yellow Dog Flyfishing Adventures hosting exotic trips and exploring new destinations.

Jeff has always been a favorite with our club, as he brings us a sense of humor, enthusiasm, approachability and more than forty years of entertaining and informative experiences.



Last year the FFCOC's On the River Classes and Clinic got off to a great start. Joe Libeu lead the way by providing six hours of classroom training followed by a two day Clinic on the Owens River for 16 participants with help from 8 experienced FFCOC members. The training was focused on learning the basics of fly fishing and was in follow

up to FFCOC's Annual Casting Clinic. This year's program will be similar with preference given to New Club Members. Add address

The program will include everything needed to plan and prepare for a successful fly fishing trip.

Classroom training subjects include:

- ◆ Equipment and rigging for nymph fishing
- ◆ Insect life cycles and how flies imitate them
- ◆ How trout behave
- ◆ Clues as to what fish eat
- ◆ Stream care and etiquette
- ◆ Reading the water
- ◆ And much more

The On the River Clinic will be held on the Lower Owens River near Bishop, CA. Many of the items discussed in the classroom setting will be covered in the field. In addition, the following will be included as part of the on the river clinic:

- ◆ Reading the stream
- ◆ In-stream entomology
- ◆ Casting including mending
- ◆ Setting the depth of flies using indicators
- ◆ Numerous demonstrations
- ◆ Fishing, one-on-one with experienced club members

This training will be in follow up to FFCOC's annual Casting Clinic scheduled for Saturday August 27. The Casting Clinic is open to the public so you can bring your friends and neighbors! If you would like information regarding the casting clinic, you should contact Art Prangley at:

San Gabriel Mountains National Monument Management Plan

Dear FFCOC Members,

Below is an email written by Bill Reeves who is a former member of FRVC and very involved with following the San Gabriel Mountains National Monument Management Plan. The plan is quite lengthy (200 pages), but Bill has identified a few pages with issues specific to the West, North and East Forks of the San Gabriel Rivers.

This is your opportunity to have a voice in the future state of the San Gabriel Mountains. It is all of our responsibility to ensure this recreational area is preserved for future generations to enjoy.

The email below has some time sensitive dates beginning with a Webinar that was on September 10th (I apologize for the late posting of this message) and any **personal replies must be sent no later than October 17th**.

Hello fellow fishermen:

I am writing you to today because we are in the public response period for the draft of the **San Gabriel Mountains National Monument Management Plan**. In the last draft plan there were only nine responses about either fish or fishing, which I consider a very low response relative to all the people that fish or care about the fish in our local mountains. If you are one who does not care what we leave for the future, you can stop reading now and leave it to the nine or so that responded last time. **YOU ONLY HAVE UNTIL OCTOBER 17 TO REPLY.**

If you only have a little time **YOU CAN GO TO A.N.F. WEBSITE** <http://www.fs.usda.gov/angeles/> and read a summary and comment digitally. You can just say how much you enjoyed fishing in our forest and hope your offspring will be able to in the future.

If you have time to read the **DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT** I have made a few reference points for you that you can respond to and feel free to make more.

Biological Resources

1. pg.18-20 The North and East Forks of the San Gabriel River were added to the Critical Biological Land Use Zone (CBLUZ) list. These were not on the prior list and why aren't these CBLUZ bigger?
2. pg. 29 I would like to have seen the remnant population of Southern steelhead the East Fork San Gabriel Rivers on the list.
3. pg. 40 Surface water on the East Fork... who is taking the lead the SRWQCB or the FS? This is a decade's old problem it's been on the EPA's list of the 10 worst polluted streams since the early 2000's. The FS has had personnel and leadership changes in these years but someone has to make something happen for the sake of all the water users.

For years we have been asking for a new trail on the West Fork of the San Gabriel River to go around Cogswell Dam to fish the Upper West Fork after it was closed to thru hiking after 9-11 by Homeland Security and the Station Fire.

We would like to see improvements made at Crystal Lake Recreation Area and Cold Brook Camp Ground and maybe a new picnic area at Morris Dam.

If you have time while on their website sign up for the webinar on Sept, 10th 1-3pm.

If you have time go to one of the 4 public meetings. I will be at the one in Arcadia.

Fly Tying

Flies That Keep On Giving

Southern Utah has drawn me in for years now and this fly worked quite well while on the most recent trip with the club to the Loa area. This nymph caught a wide range of fish in off colored water of the streams.

The Green Printz

Hook:	Daiichi 1710 Nymph Hook #14 or similar
Bead:	3/32" Gold Tungsten Bead
Thread:	UTC 70 Black
Tail:	Goose Biots, Brown
Dubbing:	Orvis Hare's Ice Dub, Olive
Legs:	Ginger Hackle, Chinese neck
Wings:	Goose Biots, White
Head Cement:	Super Glue



Place the bead on the hook small hole first. Start your thread behind the eye and wrap to the bend. Tie in two brown goose biots flared slightly to either side of the bend and leave a body length to the rear. Smear a slight amount of super glue on the shank. Dub a noodle and wrap forward to the bead forming a tapered body. Form a collar with a Chinese hackle to make the legs and trim off the top where the white biots will lay. Tie in two white goose biots flaring to either side the length of the body and tie in well cut excess biots from the front. Smear a slight amount of super glue on the thread and whip finish the head. Cut your thread. Head to Utah for some fun.
