

## UK ANGLING LEGEND CHARLES JARDINE

### MAKES RETURN VISIT

Prepare yourself for a unique insight into the life of one of the world's most accomplished fly fishermen. *Streams of Consciousness – 50 Years of Learning* will cover lessons learnt fishing the USA but also the hard core of competition and European river strategies. The program will explore Charles' belief that: "All techniques have relevance when fishing any river, anywhere, any place in this universe. Tactics (and fish) know no barriers or languages." It is normal for us newsletter editors to edit the bios we receive from presenters. As you read Charles' biography you will appreciate why we kept his words intact and unabridged.

Charles Jardine has been fly fishing for 56 years: which is a very long time to not have learned much. During that time, he has cast and fished (and also written and painted) around a good bit of the globe. Won a few awards and made as much chaos as he possibly can.



Jardine guided (and still does, sometimes) on the Southern English Chalk streams; been extraordinarily fortunate to be honoured by the Federation (of Fly Fishers), with Ambassador Award; the President's Pin awards (which he cherishes) and being a honoured as a Legend of American Fly fishing (curious, for someone from Southern England.) which was very flattering! He has written (and illustrated) quite a few books, which have, curiously, done quite well. Notably the Classic (Sotheby's: in the UK) Guide to Fly-Fishing that was published in 5 different languages and sold over 80 thousand copies world-wide. – quite a lot for an angling book! (apparently). He has also written, illustrated and contributed to over twenty more.

Charles was humbled to be awarded Game Angler of the year by sky sports a couple of years ago, and silver medallist at the ESPN Outdoor Games in update New York.: (Luck!!) Jardine was at the very start and the formation of the IFFF Casting certification programme. He maintains a close association with Sage and RIO products (he has been associated with Sage s long as any normal person can remember). He has been Chair of the prestigious Fly Dressers Guild (and remains Vice Chair).

Currently he is, very proudly, the director of the England Youth Fly Fishing Team; and working on his opus – Fishing 4 Schools. Directing operation with TCAF and taking our fabulous sport into urban areas and less privileged populations, where he sees fishing as a true opportunity for young people to learn and heal from, and a chance to enthuse a future generation as well as address mental; health issues – an area where the calm of angling can play a significant role in helping.

His passion remains undiminished. And whilst a little slower, still tries to keep up with his Black Labrador, Midge and does his best keeping pace with his fabulous two children *Angling Fanatical*, Alex and *the skate and surfboard queen*, Annabelle.

## 2018 Fly Tying Program Description

The Fly Fishers Club of Orange County (FFCOC) offers fly tying classes to its members to help them develop fly tying skills and enhance their fly fishing experience.

The FFCOC Fly Tying program attempts to provide a framework of classes that progress from first-time beginners to advanced fly tiers with each level of instruction building on prior levels.

### Fly Tying Class Descriptions

The goal is to accommodate up to 20 students grouped in four classes of up to 5 students each. Each set of classes will be offered in five sessions. The classes offered will include Fly Tying 101 (New to Fly Tying), Fly Tying 102 (Beginning Fly Tying), Fly Tying 103 (Intermediate Fly Tying), and Fly Tying 104 (Advanced Fly Tying). All of these levels may not be offered for a given series of classes depending on the interests and skills of students that sign up. All participants should plan on attending all class sessions, be on time, demonstrate competence to be at the level of class attended, and practice fly tying (yes, homework) per instructor requests.

On the next page is a description of each class level and student skill expectation. Use this to select the level that best matches your experience.

## Descriptions and Prerequisites for FFCOC Fly Tying Classes

### Fly Tying 101(New to Fly Tying)

This class is intended for students that have never tied flies before. In addition, students that have not tied for several years and need a refresher or students that feel repeating the class would be beneficial to their development would be welcome. The Club will supply all vices, tools, and materials for this class and associated homework. Students that have their own tools are encouraged to bring them.

Prerequisites:

- No fly tying experience is needed
- Have a goal of tying fishable flies

### Fly Tying 102 (Beginners Fly Tying)

This class is intended for students that have some fly tying experience, own basic tools and supplies for tying, and meet the prerequisites below. This class may also be appropriate for those who have tied in the past but have been away from the vice for too long.

Prerequisites:

- Satisfactory completion of Fly Tying 101 or similar class
- Demonstration of the techniques listed in the Fly Tying 101 Class description either by instructor recognition in prior class, samples of flies tied, or demonstration at the start of the first session.

### Fly Tying 103 (Intermediate Fly Tying)

The intermediate fly tying level will consist of multiple classes that focus on continued development of skills and techniques developed in Fly Tying 101 and Fly Tying 102. Intermediate students are expected to have a working knowledge of, and require limited assistance with, previously learned techniques and skills.

Prerequisites:

- Completion of Fly Tying 102 or similar class.
- Demonstration of the techniques listed in the Fly Tying 102 description by instructor recognition in prior class or samples flies tied.

### Fly Tying 104 (Advanced Fly Tying)

Advanced fly tying classes will be offered periodically based on interest of sufficient number of students for a specific program or to justify inviting guest fly tiers to participate in the Club's fly tying program. Participants should be able to tie a wide variety of fishable/commercial quality flies using common and advanced techniques. Curricula of advanced classes would be based on the interest of students or the unique skills of guest tiers asked to participate.

Prerequisite:

- Completion of multiple Fly Tying 103 or similar classes.
- Instructor recognition in prior classes.
- Provide samples flies tied if requested.



## **Pyramid Lake Outing March 13th,14th, and 15th 2018**

In what has become an annual event, this year's Pyramid Lake outing will be Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, March 12th 13th and 14th. In an attempt to miss the bulk of the weekend crowd which usually clears out by Sunday afternoon we again will fish during the week, those of you who went last year know this worked out well for the most part. If fishing is off the charts all bets are off as the number of people will triple during a hot bite!

If you have never done this trip before you are missing out on a chance to catch what may be the biggest trout of you life. The lake's native Lahontan Cutthroats *average* 3-5 pounds, with many fish pushing 10 pounds or more. **In the past a fish 10 pounds or bigger was considered a trophy. Now thanks to the introduction of the longer living Pilot Peak strain that is much longer living fish over 20 pounds are being caught!** If you are new to fly fishing the techniques are simple and easy to learn. We normally fish from ladders placed in the water at the proper distance from shore. There usually is nothing around you, but water. There is nothing to interfere with a back cast and nothing on the bottom to snag. You do not need to be a long distance caster as fish are sometimes hooked right at you feet.

Equipment that is appropriate for both kinds of fishing is usually two rods. **A 6-7 weight rod with floating line for indicator fishing and a 8-9 weight rod for streamer fishing** (a Rio DC 24ft. 250 gr. line is perfect). I will provide a more extensive list of what to bring that includes equipment, lines, flies, leaders, tippet and clothing in an upcoming e-mail.

Daytime temperature will likely be around 50 degrees F. This is a very variable temperature as we have experienced 30-75 degree temperatures in past years

You make your own travel arrangements to Reno, fly or drive. It is best to arrive by Sunday as we start fishing EARLY on Monday. Please let me know that you have arrived safely, Jim Wright (714-679-6638). Rob will be providing breakfast and lunch on Monday and Tuesday breakfast on Wednesday, as well as step ladders to fish from. Cost of the trip is \$250 per person for 3 days of fishing. I will e-mail a list of all attendees so you can communicate as to carpools, car rentals and lodging. E-mail me (jrwright1@earthlink.net) with any questions or to sign up. I will also have a sign-up sheet at the Meetings in December, January, and February.

**OUTING WILL BE LIMITED TO 12 PEOPLE!!! I am not sure of the final cost this year.**

# San Juan River, NM Outing

## April 8 to 12, 2018

Spring is just around the corner and we are planning another fantastic outing to the San Juan River in New Mexico. The clear river waters of the San Juan are the jewel of Northwest New Mexico just a short 14 hour's drive from Southern California. The river is fed from the deep waters of Navajo Lake which provide nearly constant temperature and abundant food supplies. This means many large brown and rainbow trout with substantial fight.

Both have very reasonable rates and can arrange guides as well. There are other accommodations as well. If making reservations at Fisheads, please let them know you are part of the FFCOC group.

This year, we are planning for fishing on the weekdays when all the kids have returned to school and we won't have to compete with the local weekend fishers. Plan to arrive on Sunday, April 8. If you arrive early enough, you may have the opportunity to wade fish the lower quality water. The general plan is to fish Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. These are the days that you should consider arranging guides. I strongly recommend you get a guide for at least two days to thoroughly enjoy all the fishing the San Juan Quality Water has to offer. Both Fisheads and Abe's offer package deals for two and three days guiding with lodging. Prices are the same as last year for guides and lodging.

For those non-fishing travelers, there are several historic and interesting areas nearby to explore. The city of Aztec offers some shopping for Native American products and Durango, Colorado is a short drive away as well.

We have generally gathered as a group for dinner each night. Although there are limited choices in Navajo Dam, we usually go to the city of Aztec (short 20 minute drive) for dinners at the local Chinese restaurant and Mexican food restaurant.

Two years ago I was at the Pleasanton fly-fishing show with Joe Wheat and was in search of a guide that fishes Alaska, I found a few. One guide service “Reel Action” had a picture of a brown trout tucked at the bottom of their showcase wall and I inquired where they caught large brown trout and steelhead, Steve Olufsen replied upstate New York. I was impressed with the size of the fish and costs of the trip. We left LAX 6 a.m. on the 28th of November 2017 and fished December 1-5<sup>th</sup> getting out of town just as the lake effect snow was beating it’s way to our door and the airport. They had all the fishing gear we needed and the guides. The first day was a warm up and the days that followed progressively got better except for the last day when I could get them to take the fly but was unable to land the prize. I had a fun time with friends and met a few more. We had a couple days prior to our fishing to stay in Canada over looking Niagara Falls from the 28<sup>th</sup> floor with a spectacular view of the colored falls at night. Andy Frumento was the big winner at the craps table and the next day we went on a guided tour around the area which included a Horn Blower boat ride to the falls, WOW the dynamic feeling of all that falling water is moving along with the heavy mist with everyone wearing a red parka that protected only part of you. We left Canada to end up in Fredonia New York, which was to be our home base for the next five days. The first day before out fishing we did a wine tour and met a couple that pointed us to a Bar/Restaurant called Rocco’s, our kind of joint, the owner Rocco is a fly fishing nut like us and some how related to Andy by country of origin.



## Flies That Keep On Giving

I don't mind sharing patterns that were experiments that work out well. This year while in Utah I had a few experimental flies that I always try to the dismay of the guides occasionally, they are getting to know I enjoy the experiment as much as catching. This fly along with next months fly were used separately and as a combo and both worked extremely well. We were fishing in Late September and October for Tiger Trout, Splake and Browns, they all liked them.



### Willie's Hot Butt Fall Bugger

Hook: Daiichi 1710 #10  
Bead: 1/8" Tungsten Copper, Gold or Silver it didn't make a difference.  
Thread: UTC 70 Rust Brown  
Rib: Small Red Wire  
Tail: Red Blood Marabou  
Hackle: Grizzly Hackle  
Body: Ice Dub Rusty Brown  
Glue: Super Glue Gel



Place the bead on the hook small hole first. Start your thread just behind the bead and trap the wire as you wrap down to the start of the bend leaving the wire to the rear. Tie in your tail at the bend the length of the hook shank. Tie in the hackle and leave to the rear. Dub the body from the bend to the bead. Palmer the hackle forward to the bead and secure with a few wraps of thread. Counter wrap the red wire forward to the bead and secure with several wraps of thread. Smear a slight amount of super glue on your thread and whip finish for a durable head.
