



CELEBRATING SIMPLICITY WITH PAT JAEGER

It is well known that fly fishermen can complicate anything. We are all guilty of over thinking our tactics and bringing too much gear in pursuit of the very simple trout. In January we welcome back local guide and favorite Pat Jaeger who will help us get back to basics with an exciting program aptly titled **CELEBRATING SIMPLICITY**. Pat's many years of guiding the Eastern Sierra and Northern California along with his mastery of Tenkara have given him a unique perspective on the essentials of our sport. Pat's program will be preceded by what he calls a pre-show Fireside chat.



“I would like to take a moment and dissect my fishing pack for you. I will shed some light on the gear you can leave at home and give you a list of ‘don’t leave home with-outs.’ And maybe I can be persuaded to give a little Eastern Sierra winter forecast. I am blessed to log over 200 days of year in my wet wading boots. This slide show is new for 2020 and I promise an entertaining night of concepts, formulas, Jaegerisms and images of our favorite fishing spots in the Eastern Sierra.”

Pat Jaeger has fished and explored the Eastern Sierra for more than 40 years. His journey began when he moved to Mammoth Lakes in 1978. In 1980, he became part-owner of the Trout Fly in Mammoth Lakes.

His passion turned into a profession after serving an internship at the Clearwater House on Hat Creek and a partnership with Eastside Guide Service in 1995. Currently, owner/operator of the Eastern Sierra Guide Service. Pat's blessed to be a full-time guide. He logs over 200 days a year on the water.

His guiding is based out of the Mammoth Lakes area but also a permitted guide on McCloud, Upper Sacramento and Pit River in Northern California. His winters are spent hunting trout on the Lower Owens as a drift boat operator and snowmobile fishing on the Upper Owens and Hot Creek.



Free Fly Fishing Classes and On The River Training

Sign up NOW!

The Fly Fishers Club of Orange County is offering free fly fishing classes and on the river training for its members in January and February 2020. This program is a continuation of the FFCOC's On The River Classes and Clinic training that has been a great successes providing club members introductory classroom and on the river training. Joe Libeu, a FFI Certified Master Caster Instructor, professional guide, developer and instructor for Advanced Nymphing Clinics on the Owens river, and member of our Club will provide six hours of classroom training and two days of on the river training to participants. Numerous experienced Club members will assist by Joe providing hands assistance during the on the river clinics.

The program includes everything needed to plan/prepare for and experience a successful fly fishing trip. Classroom training will be held in on the Santiago Canyon College campus in Orange where subjects will include: equipment, insects including their life cycles and how flies imitate them, how trout behave, clues as to what fish eat, stream care and etiquette, reading the water, rigging and much more. The On The River Clinic will be held on the Lower Owens River near Bishop. Many of the items discussed in the classroom setting are covered in the field. In addition, the On The River Clinic will include: reading the stream, insects including in-stream entomology, casting, mending, setting depth of flies using indicators, and numerous demonstrations. The second day on the river includes fishing one-on-one with one of the more experienced club members.

The training is focused on helping new club members learn the basics of fly fishing and is in follow up to our annual Casting Clinic held in September. Participation in the On The River Classes and Clinic is limited. New club members that signed up last September after the Casting Clinic will be given preference. All club members are welcome if we can accommodate them.

Float Tube Outing At Jess Ranch Lakes

Our first outing of the year will be at Jess Ranch Lakes located in Apple Valley approximately one hour drive from Orange County (depending on traffic).

There are three lakes on the premises, however we will be fishing on Lake One. It is a small easily navigated lake that is stocked with trout and bass, all catch and release. If you have all needed equipment, it is a great place to learn and improve your float tubing skills.

The cost to fish the lake is \$40 to fish all day. The ticket office opens at 7:00 and you have to be off the lake by 4:00 pm.

This is a Float Tubing Only lake. You are required to wear chest waders and a safety vest.

A five or 6 weight rod will do nicely, and you will need assorted flies such as midges and streamers. Barbless hooks are required.

February can be very chilly so you will need to wear layers and fleece under garments. If interested you can sign up at January meeting or contact me:

Flies That Keep On Giving

While visiting Vancouver British Columbia I stopped by Pacific Anglers a well-stocked and quite professionally run fly shop. I was looking for flies for Salmon and Northern Pike to use as inspiration tying for an upcoming trip to Labrador. Many options were available for Salmon but few for Pike. I picked up a couple for both species and here is one that works well in the Pacific North West for sea run Salmon, though I will be fishing for Landlocked Salmon, I'll give them a try.

Name ? It was in a bin unlabeled



Tail is white although the photo shows some discoloration

Hook:	Daiichi 2546 Saltwater, mash the barb please
Thread:	GSP 100 White (Gel Spun)
Tail:	White Marabou
Tail Flash:	Crystal Flash Pearl
Body:	Explanation in body of text
Body Wrap Flash:	Palmer Chenille Small Pearl
Beard:	Bright Red Dubbing (Optional)
Head:	UV Fly Finish Resin <u>Thin</u> (I prefer to make several coats)
Eyes:	1/8" Adhesive Silver Black
Glue:	Super Glue Gel Formula

Mash the barb of the hook and place in your vice. Smear the shank with a slight amount of super glue and run your thread from the eye to the start of the bend. Place a Marabou feather on top of the shank letting the tips extend a hook shank length to the rear and with thread secure it all the way forward to 1/4 from the eye, cut off excess and run your thread back to the bend. Tie in two crystal flash fibers on both sides of the tail centered and cut to the length of the tail.

Tie in the Palmer Chenille at the bend; smear a slight amount of super glue on the top of the marabou shank of the hook then palmer the Chenille forward making touching wraps and end at the ¼ point behind the hook eye, keep the fibers facing backward while you wrap. If you wish a beard tie in a slight amount of red dubbing on the bottom side of the hook shank just in front of the end of the marabou. At the point behind the end of the marabou and next to the marabou start your first coat of UV fly finish and set with a UV light. Place a smear of super glue on either side of the head where the eyes will be secured, this takes some work the first few times, add your eyes to either side of the head and wait for the super glue to set. Add one or two or more coats of UV resin setting between each application and covering the eyes. Try to keep the resin from impregnating the marabou; keep your UV light handy.

Not tried yet but it came with a recommendation from the fly shop. Who knows, I might fish the Pacific North West as well.
