

FFCOC 2020 Auction Trip Report Rockfish Fishing with Captain Eric Kramer!



On November 5, Janna and Terry Roznos were treated to a day of fishing for rockfish by Captain Eric Kramer aboard his Parker Sport Cabin fishing boat. The trip was a Live Auction purchase at our September FFCOC Annual Auction. Eric graciously donated 3 such trips on the night of the Auction.

At 0700 we were met by Eric at his home, and were escorted to his fishing vessel and boarded. Eric piloted the boat out of the Channel Islands Harbor in Oxnard and headed south to our fishing grounds off of Point Magu. The weather was perfect; blue skies, an off-shore breeze and calm seas.

The trip gave Eric an opportunity to operate and test his new Furuno fish finder. After about a 1.5 hour cruise from the harbor, we were at the planned fishing ground. Eric carefully studied the fish finder, stopped the boat, and we were instructed to drop our lines to the bottom based on the fish finder returns.

Our day's first results produced a quality catch (both in size and quantity). Limits of rockfish were onboard by end of day! Eric's new fish finder works!! It wasn't the skill of fishers, but of our host and Captain that produced an outstanding catch for the day.

At the end of our fishing day, Terry was given a heading to pilot the boat on for the return trip to the harbor entrance. While in route to the harbor, Eric filleted and bagged the day's catch for his guests. Super service!! While back in the harbor, we got to witness Captain Kramer's piloting skills as he had to back into the fuel dock for a favorable upwind approach to the dock. At day's end, we were back to our car by 3:00 pm, with ice chest full of fillets, for our return trip home to Whittier. Taco Tuesday has now been replaced by Fish Taco November at the Roznos household!

Overall, we had an outstanding trip! Thank you very much to our host, our instructor, our guide, and to our Captain; Eric Kramer. What a wonderful contribution and donation you've made to our FFCOC 2020 Auction!

Bridgeport Trip Report



The 2nd annual Club outing to Bridgeport is now complete with fishing days on Sep 26, 27 and 28. The trip was designed to allow for "free planning" by each angler for each of the three fishing days; including fishing location, with hired guide service, or on your own.

Six hearty anglers made the trip this year; under the constraints of Covid-19 (Mono County was designated as a Moderate Risk Level – Orange Status), National Forest closures due to fire risk, and wide-area smoke from active wildfires.

The smoke was thick, dark, and choking in the Mammoth area, but Bridgeport weather was perfect with clear blue skies! The Bridgeport area fishing was also fully open with no constraints.

Anglers making the trip this year were: Bob Bess, Bob Theemling, Janna Roznos, Terry Roznos, Andrew Sprowl, and Matt Romero (Southern Sierra Fly Fishers Club). Local waters fished included: the East and West Walker Rivers, Virginia Creek, Twin Lakes, Virginia Lake, and Tuolumne River (Dana Fork) in Yosemite.

Home base was the Willow Springs Motel and RV Park, approximately 5 miles south of Bridgeport. Kitchenette rooms and RV sites were available for our stay. Each evening featured a group campfire hosted by our Willow Springs staff; complete with s'mores and a selection of wines to cut the chill off our cool evenings. The campfire provided a great opportunity for the group to gather and discuss the day's fishing successes (or not). and plans for the next day (see photo above).

The best fishing results for the trip were on the East Walker River on the Nevada side of the boarder. Congratulations to Andrew Sprowl who made the 60 mile drive to Heenan Lake and successfully landed a Lahontan Cutthroat Trout to advance his quest for completion of the California Heritage Trout Challenge (see photo). Fishing the Redding Area with Anthony Carruesco

A few months ago, the club had Anthony Carruesco from AC Flyfishing as our speaker for the month. He was promoting the fishing out of Redding. John Secor and I had booked three days with his group but the dreaded Covid arrived from China and we were house bound. As time went on, I got updates from Redding that they were fishing the Sacramento and all the other locations they work. The town was almost fully open as far as restaurants and motels. So, I called and setup our trip to the lower Sac.

October the King Salmon were on the redds and the rainbows were feeding. So, we arrive and our guide for the day calls and asked if we wanted to fish for lots of 12 to 17-inch fish or did we want to fish for bigger. We thought since we had not fished in over a year, we should start out slowly.

The following morning arrives and I hook up with in the first 5 minutes catch a nice 14 inch trout then proceed to snag two salmon back to back and have to break off and lose my setups and start over. Right after that I hook a fish that turns downstream and flies me into a giant snag another lost setup. About an hour later I land a 5 pound plus fish and the morning continues with John and catching approx. 10 -12 fish each some up to 18 inches. The wind blew us off the river by lunch time. The next day was a great day with us catching in excess of 30 fish with only one a 12 inch. I caught several 4 pound plus fish and John caught several 17 – 19 inch rainbows all very fat and strong. I lost a fish that the guide estimated as a 10 to 12-pound wild bred steelhead.

The third day we went to the lowest reach that they fish but has more potential for steelhead both wild and hatchery fish. It was another good day of strong fish and steady action all day. With myself being fortunate enough to catch a hatchery steelhead of 5 pounds plus just as the day ended.
