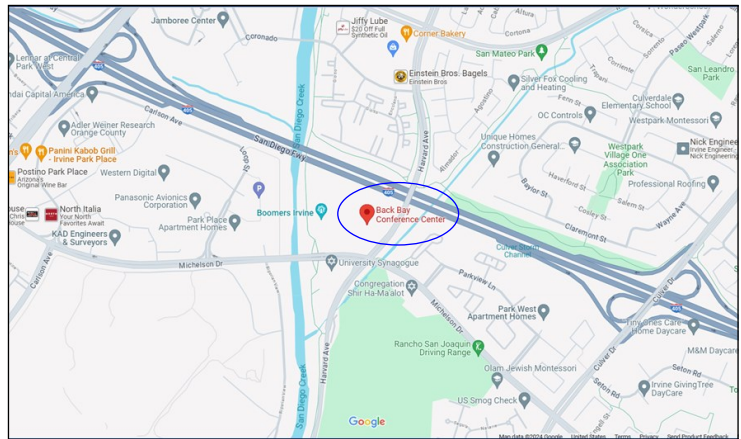

This Month's Speaker

CalTrout Projects in the South Coast and Sierra Regions

with Sandra Jacobson, Ph.D.



Sandra Jacobson, Ph.D. is CalTrout's South Coast and Sierra Director based in San Diego. She manages the South Coast Steelhead Coalition and works with Coalition partners to recover endangered steelhead and restore their habitat in Southern California.

For her presentation, Sandra will touch on CalTrout projects that promote endangered Southern steelhead recovery, the I-5 Metrolink fish passage project in Trabuco Creek, post-fire trout rescue in Coldwater Canyon Creek, and meadows restoration and forest fuels reduction for native trout and natural resource protection in the Sierra Nevada.

Sandra also works with partners in the Sierra to protect source waters, high-elevation meadows, and native trout in this magnificent landscape. She brings to this conservation effort a background in molecular biological research and project management in environmental and industrial R&D.

With a doctorate in genetics from the University of Colorado and geared toward science-based conservation, Sandra has worked closely with non-profit organizations and governmental entities for the past fifteen years to secure grant funding and build interdisciplinary teams to implement environmental projects in Southern California.

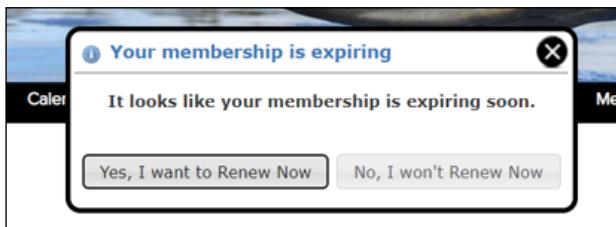

Would you like to learn how to build your own rod?

We will conduct a beginning rod building class over three Saturdays this spring. The sessions are 3 hours each day on **May 4**, **May 11** and **June 1**. You need to attend all three sessions to complete your rod.

This class will provide you with the materials and knowledge to:

1. Build your own rod,
2. Understand how to evaluate the quality of commercial rods, and
3. How to match lines and rods.

Successfully building your own rod requires some patience and practice of the skills you will learn. Anyone can do it!

This class will use kits to keep costs low and to simplify your learning curve. We negotiate a group discount and estimate the total cost to be about \$190/rod.

So, for a low investment of time and money, you will have a new rod, a new skill and broader knowledge of rod quality and function.

Please register on the website by **March 28**. Participation is capped at seven members, and we need to order kits in time for delivery.

At the end of the trip we returned to Buenos Aires where Roy and Tom stayed an extra day to go catch golden dorado, a nice end to a memorable trip.

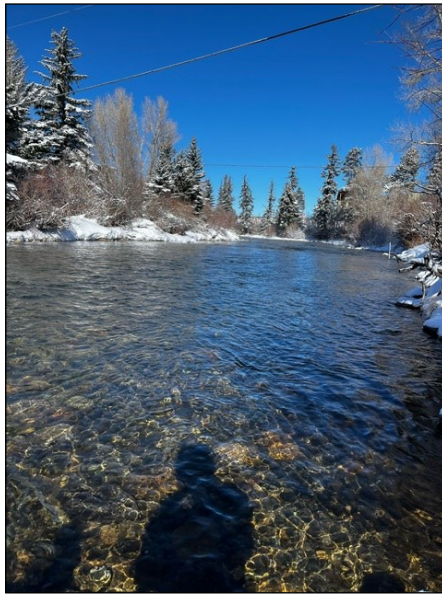

Outing Preparation

- Inventory your equipment and supplies well in advance of the outing so you arrive in Bishop prepared. If you attended On the River Training program the handouts list many of the items you should consider bringing. Make sure to get a current fishing license.
- Mentors should be familiar with Guidance For Working With Novices. They will be provided a copy if they don't have one.
- Mentors should consider fishing on their own Friday prior to the outing to get a handle on current conditions and scout places to fish.
- You should be in good physical condition to participate. Weather may be cold and wet. You should be prepared to walk at least a half mile on uneven and slippery surfaces to fishing locations.
- Wading is necessary to reach most of the good fishing locations and you may need to climb up or down slopes to enter the river. Wading staffs are highly recommended and wading belts are required.

Outing

- Friday – Travel to Bishop
- Meet up Saturday March 23rd at 8:30AM at the Pleasant Valley Campground on Chalk Bluff Road at the walking bridge.
- Carpooling to Bishop and coordination of lodging is encouraged.
- Saturday – Mentors spend the morning fishing with participants. This is a fishing buddy relationship, the mentors are not guides or in any way responsible for participant's equipment, supplies, wellbeing, etc. Saturday afternoon everyone is on their own for an afternoon of fishing. All participants are encouraged to pair up so they have a fishing buddy for the afternoon.
- Saturday evening – Informal dinner get-together - location to be announced later.
- Sunday – Meet at the footbridge at 8:30AM, answer questions participants may have and everyone is on their own for a day of fishing. Everyone is encouraged to pair up so they have a fishing buddy for the day.

Fishing: Independent fishing format. Members disperse to their desired fishing locations in the morning (as singles, or better yet, buddy up). Guided fishing is also available; Ken's Sporting Goods in Bridgeport has a list of recommended local guides for hire to put you on fish! Then after a day's fishing, the group will rendezvous at the evening campfire at our host Lodge to discuss the day's fishing, share a beverage or two, and discuss our plans and strategies for the next day.



Lodging: Willow Springs Resort ([Willow Springs Resort in Bridgeport, CA](#)), approximately 5 miles south of Bridgeport off Hwy 395, is our home base for the outing. Standard single rooms (queen bed), Kitchenette rooms (one queen and one double bed) for those who wish to buddy up and share a room/expenses, and 30A full hook-up RV sites are available for your lodging choices.



Standard Single Rooms are \$150/night. The Standard Room includes: One queen bed, Private Bathroom, Wi-Fi and Satellite TV, Heating and Air Conditioning, Mini refrigerator, Microwave, and Coffee maker.



Kitchenette Rooms are \$200/night. Kitchenette Rooms include: One queen bed, One double bed, Private Bathroom, Wi-Fi and Satellite TV, Heating and Air Conditioning, Coffee maker and Toaster, Microwave, Mini refrigerator, Stove top range, and Silverware/dinnerware/cookware.

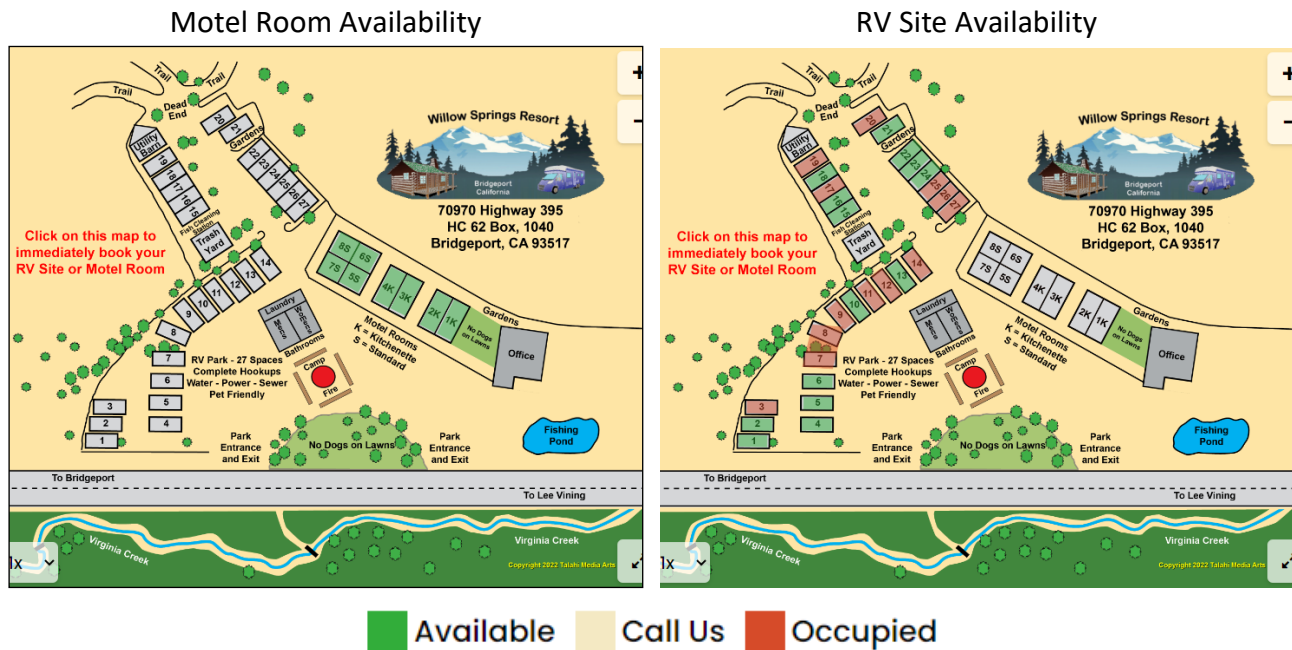

Sign Petition to Save Southern Steelhead from Extinction

Now is the time to raise your voice to protect an iconic native species from extinction!

The evidence is undeniable: Southern California steelhead teeter on the brink of extinction. Southern steelhead serve as crucial indicators of watershed health and river ecosystem integrity. These fish play a role within the ecosystem that you, your family, neighbors, and friends are also a part of. If one piece of the ecosystem changes or disappears this ripples throughout the rest of the ecosystem affecting every other species - plant, animal, and human.

Historically, Southern steelhead thrived, with tens of thousands of them swimming through Southern California rivers and streams. Today, it's rare to see them in double digits. Their dwindling numbers stem from habitat loss, fragmentation, and the encroachment of urbanization. *We must act urgently to prevent the irreversible loss of this species.*

In 2021, conservation nonprofit CalTrout submitted a petition to the California Fish and Game Commission to fully protect Southern steelhead as endangered under California's Endangered Species Act. *Listing these fish as endangered would promote actions to protect them including removing obsolete dams, improving habitat, securing instream flow, and restoring watersheds.* All of these actions would also benefit human communities. For example, improving aging infrastructure would reduce the risk of flooding and increase public safety and holistic watershed restoration would enforce and build strong relationships throughout the community.

In January 2024, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife submitted a peer-reviewed species status report to the Fish and Game Commission. Their extensive review came to the same conclusion as CalTrout's initial petition – the Commission found the petitioned action to list Southern steelhead as an endangered species under California's ESA **to be warranted**. With the CDFW species status review period complete, the Fish and Game Commission has tentatively scheduled this item for their April 2024 meeting. In this meeting, the Commission will formally decide whether the species should be listed as endangered, or whether further action is not warranted.

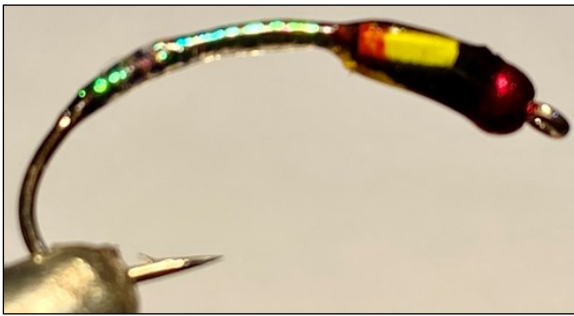
Flies That Keep On Giving!

Electric Blue Buzzer

Watching Davie McPhil on U-Tube has been educational, if you are a serious tier you can't find a better teacher. Davie was tying a buzzer and I decided to try it as I always do in Utah. WOW, he showed me a trout food that works so well I carry many with me. Yes, this seems big but the fish are the judges.

Materials:



Hook: Daiichi #1160, Size 10
Bead: 3/32 Blood Red Plummeting Tungsten
Thread: UTC 70 Black
Abdomen: Opal Tinsel Large
Wing Buds: Stripped Yellow Goose Biots
Glue: Super Glue Gel Formula
Permanent Red Marker
Fly Covering: UV Thin Formula

Instructions:

1. Slide bead on hook and place in vice.
2. Start thread at bead and wrap rearward to pictured point.
3. Tie in Tinsel, wrap the thread forward to behind the bead, smear a slight amount of super glue on shank from tie in of tinsel to behind the bead and wrap forward the tinsel overlapping slightly.
4. Remove two biots and cut the curly base. Run the thread back third of the way back from the bead.
5. Tie in one biot on either side of the hook slightly below the center of the shank with the concave side against the shank and run the thread forward to behind the bead.
6. Fold each biot forward and secure with a few wraps of thread. Place a ever so small smear of super glue at the tie in point behind the bead and secure with a few whip finishes.
7. Place a small mark as pictured with the marker on either side of the biots.
8. Reposition the hook to have the eye pointing down and smeared UV cure on the entire fly from the rear to the eye. a rotary vice works well at this point. Add a little more cure to the biots behind the bead. Rotate the vice as you cure the UV or it will run to fill the eye or to the back of the hook.
9. Admire your work and head to the lake as this is a super fly for trout.
