### FLIES THAT KEEP ON GIVING By John Williams

I was asked to copy a fly for a friend and it started me on a new quest. I'm not showing his fly but I will show you my newest baby. It started out to be a Damsel fly nymph but looks closer to a small Sculpin. What is new is the hook and direction it travels. It's tied on a jig hook and is balanced to lie with the hook on top and bounce on the bottom.

### Willie's Baby Sculpin

Hook: Umpqua C400BL Size 8

**Thread:**Olive UTC 70

Extended Shank: Straight Pin Eyes: Medium Bead Chain Eyes

Rib:UTC ultra wire in small Chartreuse

Tail & Body: Strung Blood Marabou in Damsel Green



Cut the straight pin a length from the hook point to the eye with side cutters. Cut a pair of eyes from the bead chain, Place the pin in the vice and tie the bead

chain eyes on at the head of the pin and remove from vice and super glue with a slight amount and allow to dry. Lay the straight pin on the shank of the hook while in the vice and take several soft wraps of thread around the shank and pin to secure, whip finish and remove from vice. Cut a short piece of tippet thread it through the eye, by pulling out the shank of the pin balance the rig like a scale. You want it to be slightly forward or level. Put the hook with the pin attached back in the vice and tie in the rib from the eye to the bend. Tie in the marabou with a tail extending a hook shank length from the bend. While holding the marabou rearwards smear a slight amount of super glue on the shank to the eyes. Wrap the marabou forward covering the hook and pin to the eyes. Counter wrap the wire rib to the eyes. Tie in a pheasant rump feather on either side of the hook to form the fins.

Head to some slow water, pond or lake let the big fish find you using a slow bounce technique.

# Fall 2013 FFCOC Fly Tying Classes By Cheryl Moore

The FFCOC is putting together fly tying classes that will enhance your fly fishing experiences. These classes will be given at no cost to our club members. We are offering beginning, intermediate and advanced fly tying. The classes will be held one night a week and will run for six weeks. Our club is very happy to accept the offer of the REI/Tustin store to host these classes in their Community Room. The REI/Tustin store is located in the Tustin Ranch Market off the 5 freeway at Jamboree, between Best Buy and Total Wine.

For the beginning class, we have a limited number of fly tying vices. You will be able to take these vices home to practice your tying. The FFCOC will furnish all of the tying materials and hooks. All you will need to do is bring your basic fly tying tools. You will learn how to handle various feathers, hair, synthetics and hackles as well as learning how to spot good/bad materials. Proportions, size and color will also be on the agenda. The instructors will give you approximately three different fly patterns a night. Classes will run from 6:00 pm to 8:30 pm. All of the classes will be held on a Tuesday night. The dates for the fly tying classes are October 15, 22, and 29, 2013 as well as November 5, 19 and 26, 2013.

These classes are a fantastic opportunity to learn a new craft and/or elevate your tying skills. By the time you have completed your classes, your fly box will be stuffed with new and exciting fly patterns. ### Sept. 20-22 NON-DROFIT FFF FLY FISHING FAIRE HIGHLIGHTS MAMMOTH WEEKEND

MAMMOTH LAKES, Calif. – In what might be officially described as a three day three ring circus of all things fly-fishing, longtime anglers and newcomers to the sport will mingle at the Southwest Council International Federation of Fly Fishers end-of-summer Faire, Sept. 20-22.

Faire hours are Fri., 9-5; Sat., 9-5; and Sun., 9-3.

The intensive, all-encompassing homage to the ancient game of fly-fishing will be conducted by about 100 FFF volunteers, local fly-fishing guides and personalities at Cerro Coso College, 101 College Parkway in Mammoth, with "classrooms" stretching the Eastern Sierra from Bishop to Bridgeport.

"The Fly Fishing Faire will be a potpourri of the sport with clinics, workshops, films, casting, fly-tying, vendor displays and every aspect of fly-fishing," said Connie Bullock, Santa Clarita, who chairs the event. Fly Fishing Faire admission is \$15 adult or \$20 per family; ages 16-years and younger are free. Eastern Sierra residents receive a \$5 discount. A single admission is good all Faire days. Some workshops and seminars are included in the Faire admission; other classes will have separate registration, materials or participation fees. \$15 for one or \$20 for both films will be charged for motion picture showings.

There will be two film showings Fri. at the Minaret Theater in Mammoth Lakes. The Manzanar Fishing Club, the story of the World War II Eastern Sierra Japanese-American internment camp, will be seen at 6. The 2013 edition of the International Fly Fishing Film Festival screens at 8. Films in the IF4 include both full-length features and shorts: Cast Alaska II, The Last Salmon Forest, Surf's Up, Only the River Knows, A Deliberate Life, Competition, Beard Chronicles, California Trout and Angry Rain.

Saturday night's dinner will feature photographer, world traveler, writer and casting champion Brian O'Keefe.

Exhibiting vendors will have display booths including end-of-the-season sales on rods, reels, waders, boots and other tackle at reduced prices.

Faire proceeds will be utilized for fly-fishing with Boy Scouts, conservation and education projects including Trout-in-the-Classroom; and Project Healing Waters activities with wounded veterans in cooperation with VA Hospitals.

The Southwest Council is composed of 23 individual conservation and education fly-fishing clubs in Southern California and Southern Nevada, part of the International Federation of Fly Fishers (IFFF.) "Our raffle prizes include a 'laundry list' of rods, reels, fly lines, flies, fishing trips, guided trips, fishing accessories and clothing including a \$750 value Sage Zero 4-weight flyrod," said Bullock.
