Flies That Keep Giving

Many Years ago I used to travel by horse back and pack the Sierra's. I saw a tying material that was free and everywhere if you wanted it. Horse hair, tail and mane hair comes in several natural colors and is free if you want to travel to a stable. I have found Tandy Leather a reliable source and the stuff is clean, not like the stable variety. What can you tie with horse hair, great midges?

Banner Midge (my horse's hair)



(Scanned #18 the post doesn't scan.)

- Hook: TMC 2488 #16-20
- Thread: UTC 70 Black
- Post: Antron Yarn fibers
- Body: One light one dark horse tail fiber
- Hackle: Grizzly Saddle feather sized to match hook

Start the thread at the eye and run it back ¼ of the way. Tie in the post leaving it extend the length of the lower hook point shaft and cutting the rest off just behind the tie in point. Tie in the horse tail fibers and warp over them to the middle of the bend and run your thread to the tie in point. Counter warp the horse hair forward to the tie in point and tie off with several wraps of thread. Tie in the hackle and make three to four warps and tie off. Whip finish and head cement.

This is a secret fly I've been holding many years.

SAN JUAN RIVER, NEW MEXICO

April 12-16 2014

Last year fourteen club members and family traveled to Aztec, New Mexico to fish the San Juan River, and we had a great trip. We are planning a return trip in 2014 and now is the time to get your name on the list for some fantastic fishing.

The San Juan River is located in Northwest corner of New Mexico, about 20 minutes from Aztec, New Mexico. The San Juan River is a tailwater, famous for it's large fish, eating tiny midges and baetis mayflies. It fishes well year round trip. Guide prices are \$375 for two people/full day and lodging is 85-90/night for two people. Participants can elect to use a guide for 1-3 days or wade on their own, all or some of those days.

If you have never fished the San Juan River before, it is recommended that you use a guide for at least 1-2 days. Participants have the options of A. driving (750 miles=12 hours), B. flying to Farmington, New Mexico (about \$462 with two stops) and driving to Aztec (about 20 miles) C. flying to Albuquerque (\$360-\$410) and driving to Aztec (about 3 hours). Everything shown will have a sound track in English, or Marica herself will be narrating live (yes, in English) a number of the-chosen-just-for-us clips. Alberto and Marica have, for more than two decades now, been traveling and fishing around the world and been expert guides for many waters in the USA, particularly in the West. Since 2000 they have been promoters and guides for the freshwater frontier of Mongolia and of special saltwater fishing in the tropical waters of the Maldives and the Seychelles. In Italy they participate in seminars and teach at fly fishing schools for many different clubs and associations. Personal Details - Alberto Salvini

Alberto was born in 1962 and started fishing at five with his two uncles Pino & Tony de Angelis, Italy and World champions of fishing in the '60s and '70s. He has been fly fishing and fly tying since 1981 and has been extensively traveling, first as a fashion model for Gucci, Valentino, Armani and Versace (just to name a few) and then as a marketing director for his family company that specializes in lottery technologies. During his trips he never forgot to bring his fly fishing gear with him, and he had the pleasure to test the most famous fresh and salt waters around the world across many countries, including most of the United States, Canada, the Bahamas, Cuba, the Antilles, Barbados, Belize, the Dominican Republic, Chile, Argentina, Ireland, Great Britain, Iceland, Sweden, Norway, Germany, Spain, France, Corsica, Austria, Slovenia, Italy, Greece, Malta, Nigeria, Zambia, Sri Lanka, the Maldives, the Seychelles, Mongolia, Australia and New Zealand. In 1995 Alberto decided to turn his passion for fly fishing into a career, so he began writing and taking photos for several Italian and international fly fishing magazines as a freelance journalist. Moreover, he received many invitations as a "guest star" in video series on fly fishing for international media networks. From 1996 to 2000 he appeared as a special guest star in the TV show "Seasons," broadcast by D+, the first European satellite channel dedicated to fishing and hunting, as a fly fishing expert and contributor. Over the years, he has become a fly tying designer for the US manufacturing company Rainy's, Inc., and a designer of fly fishing tools and gears for several international companies.


