This Month's Meeting

Argentina: Where Dreams Come True With Peter Koga and John Williams



Argentina is the eighth largest country in the world with a population of 43 million people. The majority of the population speaks Spanish. Argentina's capital, Buenos Aires, is located approximately 6,000 miles from Los Angeles.

This beautiful country is the home of pristine rivers and lakes; the Andes – the longest continental mountain range in the world; the Gaucho; Asado (Argentine bbq); Malbec – the pre-

miere Argentine Tinto (or red wine); and of course the Tango, the most provocative dance spectacle that you'll ever witness people

doing with their clothes on.

Did I mention it is also a country with some of the best fishing in the world? This is a part of the world that's populated by Europeans that were civilized well before the American West. It is not a Third World experience, but rather a cultural and angling destination that has become a passion for many anglers.

Our program this month is on Lago Strobel, or better known as Jurassic Lake, located in southern Argentina in the Santa Cruz province of this beautiful country. Our speakers for the



evening are Peter Koga and John Williams who, along with ten other FFCOC members, fished this outstanding piece of water.

Jurassic Lake is very large – about 30 square miles in size with an elevation of 3,000 feet. Here the Rainbow Trout are measured in kilos and pounds – not in inches. These huge Rainbows average 6 to 10 pounds with countless fish in the mid-teens, as well as good numbers of fish into the 20 pound class. When hooked these fish may jump several times and will have your reel screaming as they head into deeper water. In 1989 McCloud River smolt from California were first introduced to the waters of Jurassic Lake. These small, planted fish met with a near perfect environment and have grown big and strong in Jurassic Lake.



Peter and John will talk about this extraordinary fishery, and how it made dreams come true for twelve adventurous anglers that fished Lago Strobel in December of 2015. They will also speak about how to prepare for this trip, your abilities and skills as an angler, equipment, fly patterns, check lists, and the best way to travel and enjoy the Argentine country.

If you ever dreamed about catching the Rainbow Trout of a lifetime, are planning a trip to Argentina, or just want to see how fishing Jurassic Lake has affected the lives of twelve FFCOC anglers, you will not want to miss this program.

Please join Peter Koga and John Williams as we travel to Argentina, where dreams come true. See you there... and remember to pursue your fly fishing dreams!

Casting Clinic Update





Saturday, August 27th 8:00AM to 1:00PM

For those new to fly fishing or wanting to learn more about this fun and exciting way to enjoy our great outdoors.. Join us! Expert casters and fly fisherman will be hosting a casting clinic at Mile Square Regional Park in Fountain Valley to demonstrate and coach attendees in basic fly casts, tips for intermediates, ways to improve your casting... which will improve your fishing!

We'll also have a **BBQ lunch** after the sessions so you can neighbor with other FFCOC members and avid fly fisherman. Share info on the great spots to go fish, ideas on the best gear to get started with, learn more about our club.

<u>What to Bring?</u> If you have a favorite fly rod, reel, line and leader.. Bring it. If not, the club has equipment for you to use. Bring sunscreen, hat and eye protection (sunglasses or glasses).

Where: Mile Square Park - Shelter 1 at the South Pond

Directions from southbound Interstate 405 - Exit Warner Avenue and travel east to Euclid Street (about 1¾ mile), turn left on Euclid Street, turn left into first park entrance (there is a \$5.00 parking fee). **Shelter 1** is at the pond just past this entrance.

Directions from northbound Interstate 405 - Exit Euclid Street and turn left at signal traveling north on Euclid past Warner Avenue (about 1 mile), turn left into first park entrance (there is a \$5.00 parking fee). **Shelter 1** is at the pond just past this entrance.

Tipping is considered normal, \$40-50 per day per person.


Lodging & Food: Circle Valley Anglers has a house attached to the fly shop it rents for \$99 per night and sleeps 3. Very comfortable





Last year the FFCOC's On the River Classes and Clinic got off to a great start. Joe Libeu lead the way by providing six hours of classroom training followed by a two day Clinic on the Owens River for 16 participants with help from 8 experienced FFCOC members. The training was focused on learning the basics of fly fishing and was in follow

up to FFCOC's Annual Casting Clinic. This year's program will be similar with preference given to New Club Members. Add address

The program will include everything needed to plan and prepare for a successful fly fishing trip.

Classroom training subjects include:

- Equipment and rigging for nymph fishing
- Insect life cycles and how flies imitate them
- How trout behave
- Clues as to what fish eat
- Stream care and etiquette
- Reading the water
- And much more

The On the River Clinic will be held on the Lower Owens River near Bishop, CA. Many of the items discussed in the classroom setting will be covered in the field. In addition, the following will be included as part of the on the river clinic:

- Reading the stream
- In-stream entomology
- Casting including mending
- Setting the depth of flies using indicators
- Numerous demonstrations
- Fishing, one-on-one with experienced club members

This training will be in follow up to FFCOC's annual Casting Clinic scheduled for Saturday August 27. The Casting Clinic is open to the public so you can bring your friends and neighbors! If you would like information regarding the casting clinic, you should contact Art Prangley at:

Flies That Keep On Giving

Once upon a time there was an ANT that fell into the water and was gobbled up by a **Big Fish**, true story. Yes, fish do eat ants when there are available.

RED SINKING ANT



By John Williams

Hook: Daiichi 1510 #12 Thread: UTC 70 Black

Black Bead: Countersunk Tungsten Bead in Black

Red Bead: Red Glass Bead found at Michael's match

size to black bead

Legs: Centipede Legs Medium, Speckled Tan

Glue: Super glue gel control



Slide the black tungsten bead on small holefirst. Next the red glass bead. Push the bead all the way to the eye and place a slight drop of super glue on the rear area where the red glass bead will sit. Start your thread on the super glued area and run to the bend of the hook and then slide the red bead onto the back of the shank over the super glued area and make a thread dam behind the red glass bead. Carefully on the underside of the shank bring the thread under the glass bead and to the front of the glass bead. Make a tapered dam in front of the glass bead and move forward to the black bead and build a dam to secure that bead in place. Move the thread to the center between the beads and tie in your Legs. Finish the leg tie in area by smearing super glue on a small section of the un wrapped thread and make four or five wraps in the leg tie in area and hold a few seconds for the glue to set and cut your thread and your done. This is an extremely effective fly in moving water.
