

San Juan River, NM Outing April 8 to 12, 2018

Spring is just around the corner and we are planning another fantastic outing to the San Juan River in New Mexico. The clear river waters of the San Juan are the jewel of Northwest New Mexico just a short 14 hour's drive from Southern California. The river is fed from the deep waters of Navajo Lake which provide nearly constant temperature and abundant food supplies. This means many large brown and rainbow trout with substantial fight.

Both have very reasonable rates and can arrange guides as well. There are other accommodations as well. If making reservations at Fisheads, please let them know you are part of the FFCOC group.

This year, we are planning for fishing on the weekdays when all the kids have returned to school and we won't have to compete with the local weekend fishers. Plan to arrive on Sunday, April 8. If you arrive early enough, you may have the opportunity to wade fish the lower quality water. The general plan is to fish Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. These are the days that you should consider arranging guides. I strongly recommend you get a guide for at least two days to thoroughly enjoy all the fishing the San Juan Quality Water has to offer. Both Fisheads and Abe's offer package deals for two and three days guiding with lodging. Prices are the same as last year for guides and lodging.

For those non-fishing travelers, there are several historic and interesting areas nearby to explore. The city of Aztec offers some shopping for Native American products and Durango, Colorado is a short drive away as well.

We have generally gathered as a group for dinner each night. Although there are limited choices in Navajo Dam, we usually go to the city of Aztec (short 20 minute drive) for dinners at the local Chinese restaurant and Mexican food restaurant.


We are holding three sessions at Irvine Regional Park this year. Both with good turnout and significant results:

Fly Tying

Flies That Keep On Giving

By "Pappy" John Williams

Good friends and flies are worth keeping, A good friend shared this fly with me several years ago and it has proven to be a good friend, simple and easy to tie and oh so effective. Ants get swept into the water and they become a treat for fish.





Hook: Orvis Tactical Barbless #8

or similar

Thread: UTC 140 Black

Eyes: Medium Bead Chain Black

Tail: Black Goose Biots

Thorax: D Rib Black

Legs: Black Goose Biots

Wing Case: Pheasant Tail Fibers Black

Thorax: Black Ice Dub

Head Cement: Gel Control Super Glue

Start your thread two-eye spaces behind the eye. Smear a slight amount of super glue on the section of the hook you just started the thread. Place a pair of bead chain eyes on the glue and secure with wraps and figure eight so the eyes are perpendicular with the shank. Run the thread to well into the bend and tie in two biots, one on either side of the hook shank to form the tails. Tie in the "D" rib material on the far side at the base of the tails and then run your thread forward forming a slight taped with it to the half waypoint and wrap the "D" rib forward forming the abdomen and tie off and trim excess. Tie in two biots to form the rear legs on either side of the hook. Pull 12 – 15 pheasant tail fibers from the stem with the tips aligned, trim off the butt ends clean and keep aligned, tie in on top of the hook shank leaving the tip to the rear. Dub this section and fold over the pheasant fibers to form the first wing case section. Tie in the next set of legs forward of the dubbing and dub just ahead of this set of legs and fold the pheasant fibers forward keeping them on top of the hook shank. Dub again ahead of the tie in of the wing case and fold over the pheasant fibers forwardbeyond the eyes making four wraps of thread to secure them ahead of the eyes, now fold them back to just behind the eyes and secure with a few wraps of thread and on the final few wraps of thread smear super glue on the thread and whip finish, this will make this fly quite durable.

O.K. my grandchildren call me "Pappy" and I love it. Take Care, John Williams
