Silver Creek Project



The Silver Creek Project has been removing brook trout from a Lahontan cutthroat trout recovery stream, and has been a collaboration over the years with SWC, CalTrout, Trout Unlimited, and California Department of Fish and Wildlife. Lahontan Cutthroat Trout (LCT) are listed on the endangered species list. Brook trout were illegally stocked into Silver Creek in the stream in the early 2000's. Brook trout out compete LCT when feeding, are prolific spawners, and prey upon LCT young. Typically in a full summer we will remove 6,000-8,000 brook trout. The ratio has been about 450 brook trout to one LCT. This year CDFW's schedule won't allow them to be up there for the whole season. They will be on Silver Creek for one week in September and a week in October, focusing on removing spawning brook trout. We don't want to lose any of the hard work we have done up on Silver Creek.

When we started this project we knew it was going to take about ten years. This will be the sixth year. Dawne Emery (the DFW Fisheries Biologist for Region 6) and I are going up for two weekends in August to do some E-fishing and remove brook trout. The weekends are August 17-19 and 24-26. This will be a weekend effort so 2-3 days of working. We will do some work on Friday afternoon 2-3 hours, all day Saturday 8am-4pm, and half a day on Sunday 8am-noon. We will camp out at the campground at the end of the dirt road species (elevation is 8,500 feet). We will be E-fishing in the meadow area above the campground. Dawne and I will be running the shockers. We will need 4-5 netters, a person on the live car (capture bucket), a person or two to process brook trout, and a data person. We can have from 7-9 people helping out.

Teton Valley Lodge made a generous donation of a to last year's FFCOC auction. Doug Jones and I (Richard Fanning) were seated near each other at the auction and we were bidding against each other. At some point Doug asked who I was going with. I said I didn't know so we agreed to go together.

We just completed the trip and overall had a great time both on the water and at the Lodge.

Teton Valley Lodge is located west of the Teton Mountians near the town of Driggs, Idaho. It's reached from OC by flying to Salt Lake City, then to Idaho Falls or Jackson Hole. Then a van ride to the lodge. Unfortunately we had a 5 hour delay at OC Airport so it was a long day. But we made it there in time for dinner!

Started by Alma Kunz in 1919, the lodge has a colorful history as the first fishing lodge west of the Mississippi, attracting fishermen from the East Coast and then eventually from across the country. In the 1970s, young guides Randy Berry and John Pehrson were able to take over the operation from Alma... and now it's Randy's sons Matt and Brian who are in charge.

The lodging at Teton Valley Losdge is historical cabins which are well appointed and comfortable with modern conveniences.

Our stay included 4 nights of lodging, meals and 3 days of guided fishing. The meals were excellent and were served in a dining hall with a great view east to the Teton Mountains. There were 29 people for dinner the frist night with a little smaller group on subsequent nights.

The lodge has the ability to put out va dizen or more dift boats with guides each day. During our stay we fished to Teton River, Henry's Fork of the Snake River and thie South Fork of the Snake River. We had three different guides and each was perfessional, helpful and knowledgable.

FLIES THAT KEEP ON GIVING

By John Williams (Uncle Willie)

Beatles are an appetizer for trout, "one is just not quite enough". Some years back I met a guide Andy Fisher of North Fork Anglers in Cody Wyoming, A fantastic guide. He shared an easy pattern that was quite effective. He gave me a few shell casings which he sharpened the inside rim of to cut foam.

"38 Special Beatle"





Pardon the color imbalance, it is all Black

Hook: Firehole 718 Size 16 or similar dry hook

Thread: UTC Black 70

Super Glue: Gorilla Super Glue Gel or similar

Underbody: Peacock Herl

Head, Thorax, and Abdomen: 2mm closed cell foam Black

Legs: Wapsi RRS100 Round Rubber Small Black

Take you 38 casing and sharpen the inside rim with a small file or sharp knife. crimp it ¼ of the way to form the desired shape. Place you foam on a hard surface and place the 38 casing with the open sharpened end on the foam and press firmly or tap if needed to cut your body form. Start your thread at the eye and run slightly down into the bend. Smear a light coat of super glue on the thread from the bend to 2mm sort of the eye, now tie in two peacock herl after the butts have been trimmed and aligned by the butts and wrap forward to the ³/4 forward point. Place a slight drop of super glue in this area and set the body form with 2/3 toward the rear and the front just even with the eye of the hook. Tie in legs on either side of the narrow are and cut to your desired length. Smear a ¹/4" area of your thread and take a few wraps around the narrow area and whip finish. You have just created a Beatle, if you wish a indicator on top slice a 2mm piece of foam 2mm wide and cut to length and tie in on top of your tie off point, trim to desired exposure.
