PROVEN TECHNIQUES FOR DIFFICULT TROUT

With Mike Lawson

Happy New Year everyone, and I am very happy to say we are starting off the New Year with a truly great presenter, Mike Lawson. Mike is not only one of the most respected and knowledgeable people in our sport, he is also one of the best liked... and he will deliver a program that will show you how to achieve what most of us want to do when we go fly fishing. Mike describes his show this way:

"There are probably more big Trout in America's best waters than there were 20 years ago as a result of proper management. These Trout are usually very difficult to catch. This isn't a program on catching big fish on exotic waters like Alaska or New Zealand. This is an in-depth look at the best times, best places, best techniques and best patterns to take tough Trout on America's finest public waters."



Mike was born and raised in southeastern Idaho where he and his wife, Sheralee (who will be with Mike at our meeting) are both fourth generation natives of southern Idaho. Mike taught school in St. Anthony for six years while working as a fishing guide in the summer. For many years both Mike and Sheralee tied flies commercially.

In 1977 they opened the Henry's Fork Anglers fly shop at Last Chance, Idaho, and Mike's reputation began. He is recognized as the Guru of the Henry's Fork and his first book, published in 2000 with co-author Gary La-Fontaine, is entitled **Fly Fishing the Henry's Fork**. His articles have appeared in all the leading national and international fly fishing publications and his pictures often appear on magazine covers.

Mike is a Contributing Editor of *Fly Fisherman* magazine and has appeared

in several fly fishing videos. He was one of the three "Traveling Fly Fishermen" (along with Gary LaFontaine and Jack Dennis) who appeared throughout North America conducting seminars and weekend clinics.

Mike's most accomplished book is **Spring Creeks**. He worked on this magnum opus for 12 years, and it is the most comprehensive work on spring creeks and tailwaters ever published. This is a large, hard cover book (8-1/2 x 11 with beautiful slick paper) and includes more than 285 color photographs and 80 illustrations. It was published by Stack-pole Books and has been lauded as the ultimate writing on the subject. (Editor's Note: Mike is bringing and giving the FFCOC a leather bound limited edition copy of this book - which is a \$225.00 value - along with a Mike Lawson hand-tied fly for our club, to be used in our 2011 annual auction. He will also have a few regular copies of the book with him - and "only a few" because that is all he can carry as each one weighs four pounds. So a few lucky people will be able to buy one from Mike and have him autograph it.)

Mike is a very popular speaker and usually packs the house for his presentations. So please get your reservations in early and join Mike Lawson as he shares with us his techniques on how to catch 'Big Difficult Trout'. I hope to see you there..... and remember to pursue your fishing dreams!

Surf Fishing March 2011

Jim Edwards has agreed to host a club outing to fish the local surf in March (date tbd). Participants are to meet the group at 8am within Huntington State Beach. To get there, enter the state beach at Magnolia and Pacific Coast Highway. Then go south in the parking lot until you are parallel to the Brookhurst and PCH intersection. We will meet there, gear up and hit the surf.

Be sure to dress warm and bring your waders, boots and a good wind/water proof jacket to put on when you get there. Fishing equipment should include 7 to 10 wt rods, a stripping basket and a sinking shooting head on running line of an integrated sinking line of appropriate weight for the rod you are using.

Flys that typically work well include:

Olive/white Clouser, size 1-4

Tan/white Clouser, size 1-4

Sand crab patterns, size 2 and 4

Gracie's Shrimp



Southwest Montana

July 23 – July 30, 2011

July 30 – August 6

Fish the rivers of Southwestern Montana The Beaverhead, Ruby, Jefferson, Big Hole, and Madison Rivers and Clark Canyon Reservoir

This will be the fourth time for this trip. Past participants have had a great time, excellent fishing and good food. This time we will be going a little later in the season. There has been great fishing this time of year for the past 2 years. We are reducing the group size due to availability of lodging at the Big Trout Ranch and are adding a second week to accommodate the same number of people as before.

- 4 guided days fishing with a partner, including flies
- 2 days open for fishing at Big Trout Ranch, an unguided fishing location of your choice, local sightseeing or just relaxing (additional guided days available at extra cost)
- 7 nights lodging and meals
- Group size of 6 to 8 depending on sleeping requirements
- Choice of Week 1 (July 23 thru July 30) or Week 2 (July 30 thru August 6) based on availability



Fishing – Each day you will discuss the options with your guide and decide on a venue. The Beaverhead, Big Hole and Madison Rivers are within range and should be in excellent condition. The Ruby River is also nearby and is a good “walk-in” option for either a guided day or a “do it yourself” day. Clark Canyon Reservoir is also an option for big rainbows depending on conditions.

Guides – Again, we will be using guides from Frontier Anglers in Dillon, MT. On guided days you’ll meet your guide at the fly shop. If you’d like to be guided on one or both of your open days, it can be arranged if you let me know early. (Rates are expected to be \$450 per day for 2 fisherpersons.)

Lodging - Big Trout Ranch is a 1300 acre ranch between Dillon and Twin Bridges. We will be staying in a Ranch style house they call Kamloops. The ranch borders the Beaverhead River and has two lakes and a spring creek. Fishing last time in the larger lake was good. There is also great wildlife watching - you’ll be surprised by the many deer sightings.

Food – Continental breakfast will be available in the morning. Guides will provide hearty lunches on guided days. Otherwise, fixings will be available for lunch at the ranch. Joannie is still planning the dinner fare and it will be delicious as before.

Not included: Transportation, Fishing License, Tips, Admission Fees, etc.

This trip is being planned to accommodate 6 to 8 participants each week at \$1650 per person. There also may be some limited availability for non-fishing attendees at a cost to cover lodging and food.
