### NYMPHING LIKE A EUROPEAN with Dave Smith

In the past few seasons, the technique known as "Euro nymphing" or "tight line nymphing" has gone from being a buzz word in competitive angling to an everyday technique used by anglers throughout the world. Although simple in concept, and not so very different from what we all know as "high sticking", the technique still leaves many fly fishers scratching their head and wondering what all the fuss is about.

Competition rules prohibit the use of split shot and suspension devices (floating strike indicators), giving rise to a new style of nymph fishing that uses longer rods and heavier flies.

Every day anglers benefit from the technology advances (e.g. rod design and accessories like packs and clothing) that are passed down from competitions.

George Daniel's best-selling book Dynamic Nymphing along with various videos of Devin Olsen (both speakers on our Southern California circuit) is excellent reference material for all nymphing styles. Our July presenter, San Diego angler Dave Smith will focus on this and other tournament techniques that can easily be applied to our local Sierra fly fishing.



# July Speaker (Con't)

Dave is a multi-faceted and multi-species fly angler and fly tier who chases everything from alpine trout to Belizean bonefish, carp and make sharks. He's been a competition trout angler since 2012, with appearances nationally at two *Team USA National Championships*, America's Cup international competition, and many regional events throughout the western United States. In addition, Dave was on the Professional Fly Angling tour in 2014 and has competed internationally in New Zealand including the *Oceania Fly Fishing Championships* in 2012. Through his competition career, Dave has gathered tips and tricks from fishing a vast variety of waters all over the US and internationally.

Dave is looking to share all the hard-earned information and tricks he has learned in competition fly fishing with you. He is confident that they will equate to more fish hooked, landed and you being more efficient with your fly angling. These tactics can be applied to more than just European nymphing techniques. Dave has given presentations for multiple fly fishing clubs and organizations in the past and has lead on the water clinics and trainings for fly fishing clubs and organizations.



You will often find Dave fishing with his wife, Lesley. Together they love traveling all over the world chasing fish that will eat a fly.

The clear river waters of the San Juan are the jewel of northwest New Mexico just a short 14 hour's drive from Southern California. The river is fed from the deep waters of Navajo Lake which provide nearly constant temperature and abundant food supplies. This means many large brown and rainbow trout with substantial fight.

I have made a block reservation at the Fisheads San Juan River Lodge for rooms and Guides [ http://www.fisheadsofthesanjuan.com/]. Please contact me if you wish to attend this outing so I can assign rooms and fishing buddies. If you prefer to make your own arrangements, please feel free to do so.



Ken's Sporting Goods in town is generally the source of fishing knowledge in the area; buy some flies and a t-shirt or two, and the advice gets better!! You can also check their website for a Fish Report, but best to stop in to get the latest! You can also secure a Fishing Guide at Ken's as well; gets you access to some private waters if desired.

Generally, members disperse to their desired fishing locations in the morning. Then after a day's fishing, return back to the Willow Springs Motel to rendezvous and discuss the day's fishing successes (or not), and plans for the next day. The evening group campfire, hosted by our Willow Springs staff, provides a great opportunity for telling the day's fish stories.

Willow Springs Motel and RV Park, approximately 5 miles south of Bridgeport, is our home base for the outing. ### **Fish Tales**



June 14 - 18, 2021

Melinda Burns: Steamkeeper



On June 14, Ten Club Members experienced a trip of a lifetime. The goal was to fish and fish we did. Eight of us experienced a different guide each of the three days. Their knowledge extended beyond just fishing but included the history of the 1800-foot-deep canyon and its surrounding area.

For five days each of us experienced nature's beauty from the flats of the desert, 8,000-foot mountain tops, 3,000-foot-high plateaus, the native American Indians Navajo, and petrographs that are 1000's of years old.

Three of the guides have written books about Glenn Canyon ranging from the surrounding geological make-up of the canyon, photos of the area, to fishing strategies. The story continues with our experiences, read on and enjoy.

We arrived on Monday and had dinner at the Cliff Dwellers Restaurant which was named one of the best restaurants in Arizona by the Arizona Highways Magazine. I had to find out if my new Ford F-150 4x4 was up to the task so I put in through the paces on the 4x4 trail back to Monache Meadows this past weekend June 4-6<sup>th</sup>. I would not recommend this trail unless you have a 4x4 with good ground clearance, my frame has a new ding and a scratch or two but my truck handled like a champ.

I got invited on this trip by a couple of Bakersfield boys I had met previously fishing the Kern and to my surprise was the only angler not packing a side arm. I had been back here once before in maybe 2018 where I remember the water being much higher but I didn't get to spend as much time exploring that trip. We got back to the campground around noon on Friday and setup camp and we each headed in different directions to hit the river for a few hours that evening. I could not believe my eyes as the first run I approached that looked deep enough to be holding anything had a monster 16 inch brown who took my size 16 Elk Hair Caddis on the second drift and the big fish of the trip was in the net in my first five minutes of fishing! I probably caught another 20 fish on that Elk Hair Caddis before I got bored and decided to fool around with something else in the box.

The fishing was good in the mornings and afternoons but slowed down mid-day as water temps creeped above 70 degrees in the skinny water. I fished a few miles above and below the weir and we made our way out into the meadow on our way out on Sunday. You could easily catch forty fish a day if you stayed after it and there were runs holding a solid 50-75 fish in them.

All and All it was a great trip and I can't wait to go back after we have a decent winter....Andrew



# Flies That Keep On Giving!

By John Williams

I saw a leg pattern on the Internet and had to give this a try, it had no description of the materials So this is my variation. The legs flex in the water. Planning to try this at Hot Creek.....

# Willie's Frog



**TOP VIEW** 

Hook: Firehole 811 size 4

Thread: UTC 140 Olive

Legs: EP Fibers Tan, Olive, Darker Olive

Body: Olive Deer Hair

Marker: Black Permanent

Glue: Super Glue Gel Formula

# Flies That Keep On Giving! -continued

Smear a light amount of super glue on the entire shank of the hook and cover the shank with thread from the eye to the bend. Select a piece of each color of EP fibers and place on top of each other going from light to dark on top. I get two sets of legs out of each selection of fibers. Cut the gathered bunch in half. Place one bunch at the bend with the liter fibers facing down and secure with figure eight wraps and place a dab of super glue at the tie in point when done, let sit a minute or until dry. With a bankers clip pull down on a gathered leg and pinch with the clip to form the foot. Wrap with thread and superglue the wraps and allow drying and then removing the clip. Do the same on the other leg. Spin deer hair the entire rest of the shank to the eye and pack well and super glue the final wraps of thread at the eye with a smear of glue. I start by trimming with scissors and finally use a double edge razor blade. The shape will determine how it will react in the water, a fat head will push water and a tapered will glide smoother, it is your choice. Add spots of marks with the black marker on the topside.

Tight Lines and hold on for the big one.
