This year's program will continue with the spirit of the season, but it also will be one of the most informative and educational programs you have ever attended.



FLIES THAT KEEP ON GIVING

Everyone need an attractor nymph, not should have, but needs. I have fished enough to see it happen, I try to match the nymphs I find when turning over rocks and vegetation only to see a friend put on a bright red nymph and hook everything around.

This is but one of my bright red searching nymphs.

Red Bright& Buggy



Hook: 2488 H #10-18 or TMC 2457 #10-18

Bead: Silver to match hook size

Thread: UTC 70 Black

Tail: Pheasant tail fibers

Rib: Gold fine wire

Abdomen: Diamond Hair Red or any other bright red dubbing

Flash Back: Large Opal flashback tinsel

Thorax: Peacock hurl

Legs: Pheasant Tail fibers

Place bead on hook small hole first. Start thread at head and tie in wire as you run thread to bend. Tie in five pheasant tail fibers letting them hang to the rear the hook gape width. Dub the abdomen with the diamond hair to the two thirds forward point. Wrap gold wire to form support and rib. Tie in the flash back material and let hang to rear. Tie in three strands of peacock and wrap to form the thorax. Tie in four pheasant tail fiber on either side to form the legs. Fold the flash back material over to the bead base and tie off with several wraps and whip finish. I have been using much more super glue to secure my flies at the whip finish but that is up to you, be careful, a little goes a long way.

SAN JUAN RIVER, NEW MEXICO MARCH 24-28, 2012

The San Juan River is located in Northwest corner of New Mexico, about 20 minutes from Aztec, New Mexico. The San Juan River is a tailwater, famous for it's large fish, eating tiny midges and baetis mayflies. It fishes well year round. I am planning a club trip there in March of 2012. Guide prices are \$375 for two people/full day and lodging is 85-90/night for two people. Participants can elect to use a guide for 1-3 days or wade on their own, all or some of those days. If you have never fished the San Juan River before, it is recommended that you use a guide for at least 1-2 days. This trip will be limited to 8 people. Participants have the options of A. driving (750 miles=12 hours), B. flying to Farmington, New Mexico (about \$462 with two stops) and driving to Aztec (about 20 miles) C. flying to Albuquerque (\$360-\$410) and driving to Aztec (about 3 hours). PYRAMID LAKE OUTING MARCH 10th, 11th & 12th, 2012

In what has become an annual event, this year's Pyramid Lake outing will be Sunday-Monday, March 11th & 12th Saturday the 10th optional (see below). After consulting with Rob Anderson from the Reno Fly Shop (now closed) we decided to make it a Sunday-Monday outing in an attempt to miss the bulk of the weekend crowd which usually clears out by Sunday afternoon.

If you have never done this trip before you are missing out on a chance to catch what may be the biggest trout of you life. The lake's native Lahontan Cutthroats *average* 3-5 pounds, with many fish pushing 10 pounds or more. If you are new to fly fishing the techniques are simple and easy to learn. We normally fish from ladders placed in the water at the proper distance from shore. There usually is nothing around you, but water. There is nothing to interfere with a back cast and nothing on the bottom to snag. You do not need to be a long distance caster as fish are sometimes hooked right at you feet.

Equipment that is appropriate for both kinds of fishing is usually two rods. A 5-6 weight rod with floating line for indicator fishing and a 7-8-9 weight rod for streamer fishing (a Rio DC 24ft. 250 gr. line is perfect). I will provide a more extensive list of what to bring that includes equipment, lines, flies, leaders, tippet and clothing in an upcoming e-mail.

Daytime temperature will likely be around 50 degrees F. This is a very variable temperature as we have experienced 30-75 degree temperatures in past years

You make your own travel arrangements to Reno, fly or drive. It is best to arrive by Saturday (Friday if fishing on Saturday) to check in with our guide/host **Rob Anderson** (775-742-1754) AND myself **Jim Wright** (714-679-6638). I will be staying at the Silver Legacy Resort in down-

Winston's salt and freshwater <u>Boron</u> II-MX series. The MX stands for maximum, as in maximum power, distance, and fish fighting capabilities. The 4-, 5-, and 6-weights are slightly stiffer and faster than their Boron IIx counterparts; the 7- through 12-weights are true "cannons" that can handle sinking lines, big flies, and adverse wind conditions. While all eleven models feature faster actions and are capable of making long distance, 100+ foot casts, they will amaze you with their responsiveness and light weight. The rods come with a cork fighting butt and our new double locking reel seat. Whether you're chucking 6" long "grocery" flies or battling fly rod–humbling winds, a Boron II-MX will get the job done.

Specifically, in reference to the 6 weight, they add:

From streamer fishing for browns to battling monster pike, these 6-weights [9' and 9'6"] are up to the task. Great for summer steelhead, Atlantic salmon and schoolie stripers, too. Both rods can handle the large indicators and flesh files used in Alaska.

Subject: Stranded Fish, Upper Owens River

Dear Ms. Hawk and Mr. Martin,

Tom Loe of Sierra Drifters Guide Service recently posted an alarming notice about trout stranded in irrigation diversion ditches in the Upper Owens Valley. I called Tom, and he offered to show me the situation first hand. Tom drove me to the Longyear's section on Sunday, Oct. 30. I saw hundreds (if not thousands) of fry in the irrigation diversions of this area. I also observed approximately one hundred small trout (3- to 4-inches) under the ice. The main channel of the irrigation diversion has minimal flow, and branches from this channel have no flows. Large numbers of fry are left stranded. I suspect that even in the main channel the fish are doomed, particularly if flows continue to decrease. Tom stated that, in past years, he has always seen a few fish trapped in the irrigation diversions as flows recede. However, he is stunned (as was I) at the number of fry that are threatened this season. We ask California Department of Fish and Game and Los Angeles Department of Water and Power to please address this unfortunate condition.

For the immediate situation, we ask that flow diversions to the irrigation channels be increased and maintained until DFG staff can assess the situation and suggest possible remedies. For the future, we ask for implementation of a formal plan to prevent fish from entering these channels, or a strategy to make sure that spawners and fry have adequate flows to make their way back to the river. I am confident that member clubs of the Southwest Council, Federation of Fly Fishers would offer volunteer support for this project.

"TEACH THE TEACHERS" CASTING CLASSES IN FEBRUARY 2012

The FFF CCCIP (Certified Casting Instructor Program) with the help of Long Beach and Pasadena Casting Clubs, will present a series of two hour workshops designed to help local Club members teach beginning students in the basics of fly casting. Most Clubs offer an annual introductory casting class to attract newcomers to the sport, and these workshops will offer tips and techniques for that very important first fly casting lesson.
